Business Security/Crime Prevention Tips

The following are tips and guidelines from the Department of Public Safety to aid businesses in crime prevention this holiday season, and throughout the year.

Security:

- Limit the number of posters/signs on your windows and glass doors – this allows for an unobstructed view of your business by patrol units
- Make sure the business name and address are visible from the street – this will help ensure an accurate response from Public Safety Officers and/or Sheriff Deputies
- Install floodlights for alleyways, rear and front entrances of the business
- Secure all windows and vents to prevent access
- Install deadbolt locks, padlocks, and hasps on receiving doors

- Use solid core doors on all entrances; avoid doors with glass panes
- Trim nearby bushes and trees – this will diminish the number of hiding places for burglars
- Install a burglary alarm. Place a surveillance camera in and outside the building
- Use high quality locks, safes, and alarm systems
- Provide training for all employees (including cleaning staff) so they are familiar with security procedures



Theft Prevention:

- It is beneficial to maintain an inventory of all office equipment and keep information on the make, model, and serial number of each item
- Keep a log of keys issued to employees and change keys and combinations periodically
- Keep a low balance in the cash register. Place excess cash in a safe or deposit it in the bank
- Make bank deposits often and during business hours; do not establish a pattern, take different routes at different times of the day
- Avoid having employees work alone
- Lock unused doors
- Remove all expensive merchandise from window displays at night

90-Day Limit on Lights

At the end of the year, everyone celebrates the holiday season by decorating their homes with outdoor lights. Although they beautify homes for the holidays, these temporary lights pose a potential fire danger when left out all year.

The City of Norwalk reminds all residents that these lights may only be hung for a maximum of 90 days. The purpose for this is to eliminate the number of homes that leave their holiday lights hanging year-round or for extended periods beyond the holiday season.

Violations of the Electrical Code can result in fines of up to \$1,000 and/or six months in jail. The City's property maintenance and building inspectors will enforce this code requirement.

Deadline to Renew Business Licenses is January 31, 2010

Norwalk businesses are reminded that all business licenses expire on December 31, 2009. Owners are advised to renew their licenses by Sunday, January 31, 2010 to avoid penalties. Renewal letters will be sent out mid-December. If your business does not receive a renewal letter please contact the Finance Department.
