## **Council Moves Projects Forward in August**

Norwalk City Council decisions last month gave momentum to projects designed to give added resources to the community.

At the regular meeting of August 2, a resolution was adopted allowing for the transfer of 15 acres of property located at the southeast corner of Norwalk Boulevard and Excelsior Drive from the United States Air Force to the City of Norwalk. The property, part of an area known as the Tank Farm, will be used to expand adjacent Holifield Park, providing added open recreational space for families. The transfer will allow the City to proceed with design and to seek the grant funding necessary to pay for development of the park.

On August 16, City Council joined the Air Force, Congresswoman Linda Sanchez, Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board, and other dignitaries at Holifield Park to celebrate the ceremonial transfer. Officials commended the Congresswoman for legislation prompting the action, and thanked agencies and the community for collaborating for over 20 years in an effort to turn hope into reality.

Council also approved funding to move forward with the demolition of vacant homes and design of a resource center to be located at the site of the former Senior Center at San Antonio Drive and Foster Road. The facility, which will house several assistance organizations, including Cerritos College staff, Norwalk Chamber of Commerce and the Southeast Los Angeles County Workforce Development Board among others, will

help residents discover and get connected to education programs, career training and job opportunities as well as provide resources and training programs for business owners, including home-based businesses. The center realizes the City's 2020Vision strategic action plan goal of growing the local economy through job creation, employment and enhancing business opportunities.



In addition to impactful projects, administrative items were also addressed. Councilmembers voted unanimously to hold a special election in March to fill the seat left vacant by the June departure of former Councilmember Marcel Rodarte. By law, City Council had to decide whether to fill the Council vacancy by making an appointment or calling a special election by August 29. The special election will coincide with the regular municipal election on March 7, and may be a minor increase of approximately \$2,000 to funds already budgeted for the regular election.



City Council honored Los Angeles County Fourth District Supervisor Don Knabe at its last regular meeting of the month. The Supervisor, who retires in December, has supported numerous programs and activities for Norwalk residents, including Summer Concerts, senior transportation and nutrition, playground equipment for parks, arts and music events, and library programs. The Supervisor also created the Safe Surrender program, allowing mothers who cannot care for their newborns to surrender them at fire stations, sheriff's stations or hospitals. Supervisor Knabe, who has been in office for 20 years, thanked the citizens of Norwalk for their support. "I have had special moments in this community, and I am forever grateful."

## **Events Help Job Seekers and Local Businesses in August**

The City of Norwalk, in collaboration with state and local agencies, hosted two events to help connect people to jobs and successful career strategies. Hundreds attended the Business Resource Seminar, held at City Hall on August 17. Jerome Horton, Member of the State Board of Equalization, told business owners at the seminar that "Billions of dollars in resources are available to you." He encouraged merchants to innovate, collaborate and ask for help. Agencies like the Internal Revenue Service and Board of Equalization, usually seen as regulators or monitors, can actually serve as advocates, providing counseling and assistance. Horton encouraged the audience to seek out benefits and helpful information, "I want you all to be billionaires."





At the Job and Resource Expo, held at the Arts and Sports Complex, the California Employment Development Department projected that over 250 individuals found employment. Over 100 employers, from Starbucks and See's Candies to law enforcement and first responders, showed up to recruit candidates. Free haircuts, manicures and health screenings were provided to help job seekers present their best self. "My new haircut gave me the confidence to approach more employers, and I qualified for more jobs than I thought I would," one of the attendees told us. Veterans' resources were also available.



## **Senator Tony Mendoza Holds** Town Hall Meeting at Norwalk City Hall



Senator Tony Mendoza recently held a successful town hall meeting at Norwalk City Hall regarding his bill, SB 648, which would establish oversight for agencies that refer clients to residential care facilities for the elderly. Local seniors and their families, along with representatives from referral agencies and other stakeholders, attended the meeting. SB 648 is currently pending in the state legislature.

Said Senator Mendoza, "The town hall was a great opportunity to hear firsthand from local seniors, their families, and other stakeholders regarding my bill, SB 648."

Referral placement agencies for senior residential care facilities are largely unregulated in California. Under current law, only certain referral agencies are required to be licensed and there are no requirements for ensuring that referrals are made solely to licensed care facilities.

Senator Mendoza's bill will address gaps in current law so that every placement agency meets some licensing and disclosure requirements to ensure that seniors are not being referred to facilities that have lost their license to operate in California, or those who are fraudulent and predatory on seniors.

"My bill establishes licensing and strengthens disclosure requirements for referral agencies in order to guarantee that seniors and their families are not victimized. This will help protect them against referral agencies that engage in unscrupulous business practices," added Senator Mendoza.

#### Celebrating 40 Years of Housing Norwalk

In 1976, the City Council established the Norwalk Housing Authority to provide safe, sanitary and decent housing for low-income residents. This September, the Authority celebrates 40 years of helping thousands of residents afford decent rental housing through the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program.

The Authority currently assists approximately 700 households with their monthly rent and has 180 participating landlords. All subsidized units are inspected annually to ensure safe and appropriate living conditions.

Under the Housing Authority's program, a Section 8 tenant pays about 30% of their monthly income for rent. As tenant income changes so does the rent portion. This provides vulnerable low-income households with stable housing and participating landlords with reliable rental income. The Section 8 program further benefits the community by preventing slum conditions, overcrowding and homelessness.

The Section 8 program is federally funded, so the Authority's budget is subject to annual Congressional appropriations. Due to stagnant funding and the lack of new Section 8 vouchers, the need for housing assistance in the community far exceeds the Housing Authority's resources. The Housing Authority currently has 5,600 applicants on a waiting list which has been closed to new applications since last year.

Despite these challenges, the efficient and well trained staff continue to provide quality service that has made the Authority a high performing agency for the past ten years.




