
from the Angel Tree Project.



Call in. Clean up.

Dumping old furniture, large debris or materials is unattractive and illegal in the City of Norwalk. Proper disposal of "bulky items" on parkways is the responsibility of property owners. Luckily, there are several ways to safely and easily get rid or recycle items that are too large for trash or recycle receptacles.

Schedule a bulky item pick-up. Contact your disposal company at least two days prior to your regular collection day and before placing items on the parkway (the area between the sidewalk and curb). Single family residences are entitled to four FREE pickups consisting of five items each. Any items over the limit are subject to charges. Place items on parkway no more than 24 hours in advance. (Apartment buildings and businesses are considered commercial accounts and will be charged a fee.)

Donate large items that are still in good condition. Several charitable organizations offer free donation pick-ups: Goodwill requires a minimum of five or more large garbage bags or boxes. Permits Help Build Quality Homes & Communities

Building permits and the inspections that follow exist for your safety and protection and help safeguard your house from poor construction practices. Your home improvement project is also an investment. If your construction project does not comply with adopted codes, the value of your home may be affected and insurance companies may not cover unpermitted work.

Do I need a permit for everything I do to my home? No, not all items require permits. The following is a list of common projects that do and do not require a permit.





Do not need a permit

Painting

Carpeting

Minor repair or maintenance work that does not alter approval of equipment or make such equipment unsafe.

Need a permit

Additions

(bedrooms, bathrooms, family rooms, etc.)

Residential work (decks, garages, fences over 6 feet, fireplaces, pools, water heaters, etc.)

> Renovations rsions, windows, bathroom ai

(garage conversions, windows, bathroom and kitchen remodeling, reroofing, etc.)

Electrical & plumbing systems

HVAC systems

(heating, ventilating, and air-conditioning)

Changes to existing site drainage and grading.

Frequently asked questions

Who may obtain a building permit? Permits can be issued to a property owner or state-licensed contractor. Work on a non-owner occupied home requires a licensed contractor to obtain permits. Permits for homes that are intended for sale can be obtain by the homeowner but require a licensed contractor to perform the work. An owner may obtain the permit whether or not he intends to perform the work or hire a contractor. If a contract is negotiated for the work, care should be taken to assure that all necessary work is specified to meet code standards and we recommend all inspections be performed prior to payment in order to avoid costly corrections after the contractor has been paid and has left the job. The owner-builder is ultimately responsible for code compliance.

Where do I obtain a permit? Permits are issued by the Building & Safety Division, Room 12 at City Hall.

How much does a permit cost? Building permit fees for additions and remodeling are based on an assigned value for the work. Fees for improvements like water heater replacement, A/C equipment, plumbing fixtures and electrical service upgrades are unit priced. The Building & Safety staff may be contacted for fee estimates based on your proposed project.

How long does it take to get a permit? Certain projects such as additions, require a plan review, which takes 10 business days to complete. Simple projects such as reroofs and window replacements can be reviewed over the counter with a permit issued the same day.

How long are permits valid? Permits are valid for 180 calendar days after issuance or inspection.

Christmas Tree Recycling

Don't forget to put out your trees for recycling on your trash day! From December 27, 2016 through January 13, 2017, Norwalk residents can have their Christmas trees picked up and recycled. Trees will be reused as compost and landfill cover.



Single-family residential customers: Trees will be picked up on the same day as your trash collection. Please place trees out by the curb the night before your trash collection. A separate truck will collect the Christmas trees at a different time than the rest of the trash. If you forget to place your tree on the curb on your regular collection day, please hold off until the following week to do so; trees will only be collected on your trash collection day.

Multi-family dwelling (apartment) customers:

Residents of multi-family buildings can recycle their trees by placing them out next to regular trash containers. A separate truck will pick them up.

Guidelines for placing

your tree out:

Remove decorations: ornaments, tinsel & lights Remove metal and plastic stands. Remove wooden tree stands Flocked trees are NOT acceptable. Do not place your tree in a bag.

Trees over eight feet need to be cut in half.

Each year, your participation enables the City to recycle Christmas trees. Recycling saves valuable landfill space and helps preserve our environment.
