Only Safe and Sane Fireworks in Norwalk

Protect people and pets in your neighborhood this summer.



show. For families choosing to celebrate the holiday at home, there are some important rules to know and follow.

Only Safe and Sane, legally purchased fireworks are permitted in Norwalk. Fireworks that have an aerial effect or explode are NOT Safe and Sane.

Legal fireworks carry the California State Fire Marshal Safe and Sane seal.

Safe and Sane fireworks may be used Saturday, July 1 through Tuesday, July 4 from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. in the City. Use outside of this time period is not permitted.

Illegal or misused fireworks can have a detrimental impact on people's health and safety. Injuries to handlers or even worse, innocent bystanders, have a lasting effect. Fireworks and other activity that creates loud explosions can also adversely impact veterans of the armed forces suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). They may also affect neighborhood pets, causing them to run from the noise, potentially resulting in injury or death. Individuals found in possession of, discharging or distributing illegal firework face fines and even arrest.

The City asks for your help in the prevention of illegal fireworks use. Often, illegal fireworks hit the black market long before the 4th of July. If you witness or know about illegal fireworks transactions, report it!

Help Keep Zika Out of Norwalk

The Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District (GLACVCD)

> has confirmed the presence of Aedes aegypti (yellow fever mosquito) in Norwalk. This mosquito is known for its potential to spread Zika, yellow fever and dengue fever.

Currently the species has been found in 38 other cities in the region. These mosquitoes are NOT transmitting any viruses at this time. But their presence increases the risk of a local outbreak.

The GLACVCD will continue control efforts to suppress the population where these mosquitoes are found. In addition, they will continue surveillance of any threats these mosquitoes may pose to residents.

Residents are asked to be cognizant of conditions that encourage mosquito breeding, to remove standing water, wear insect repellent and to educate family and friends. Travelers to South America, Central America, the Caribbean or Southeast Asia are asked to take precautions against mosquito bites by using repellent.
