Joey is committed to sharing his love of boxing and experience with youth and adults in our community. His awards will be displayed in the Boxing Gym at the Norwalk Arts and Sports Complex in hopes of motivating boxers to reach their goals just as he did.

The state of the art facility, which features a double decker driving range, redesigned nine-hole course, practice putting green and a clubhouse with a community/homework room, is open to the public seven days a week, from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. Affordable fees mean more of the community can enjoy, learn and play the game: Adults play for \$6.75 during the week and just \$9 on the weekends, with juniors only \$1.74 during the week and \$2.25 on the weekends. Back to School Safety

With more students walking, riding bikes, and crossing streets, the City's Public Safety department and the Norwalk Sheriff's Department will implement a special Back to School Traffic Safety Campaign and monitor crosswalks, school zones, and school drop-off areas.



Traffic Tips & Tip-offs:

25 mp speed limit in school zones. Do not double park.

No parking in red zones, wear your seat belt.

Don't park or block bus loading & unloading zones.

Watch for children crossing in front of or behind vehicles.

Yield to children while they cross the street.

Use crosswalks when crossing children. Do not unload passengers in the street; always park legally.
