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New Neighborhood Enhancement Partnership!

In conjunction with the City's Mini Mr. Sun event clean-ups, the Neighborhood Enhancement Team (NET) has begun canvassing neighborhoods citywide, to educate the community about their responsibility to address simple property maintenance conditions that present visual blight. Conditions such as accumulation of trash and debris, overgrown weeds and grass, parking of vehicles in yards, holiday lights, canopies/tarps, inoperable vehicles, and trash containers left out in public view are common violations seen while driving through any of our Norwalk neighborhoods. Eliminating these conditions will help reduce the perceived state of deterioration in our neighborhoods, and will also increase neighborhood pride. These conditions are minor in nature and generally can be easily addressed by the respective property owner/tenant. That is the City's goal with NET – to achieve cooperative compliance from property owners to abate these conditions without the issuance of fines or misdemeanor penalties. It's a proactive education and compliance effort that will require a positive partnership.

HOW NET WORKS

NET will be conducting a visual inspection of each property in the subject neighborhood. Inspectors and Officers will place door hangers on each property to show violations for any visible blighted condition or that zero violations exist. The property owner/ resident will have 20 days to comply and take corrective action to abate the condition(s). Note the 20-day timeframe will fall within the neighborhood's Mini Mr. Sun clean-up day, to allow persons to utilize the program bins at no cost. If compliance is not achieved by the 20th day, citations and fines for each violation will be issued thereafter.

Please take a look at your yard/property, and identify if any of these blighted conditions exist now. On behalf of improving the quality of life in your neighborhood, we ask that you please take proactive action to address these concerns. Your simple actions can and will make our Norwalk community a better place!



Norwalk Transit Offers GO RIO Program & Reloadable TAP Cards

Since 2006, Norwalk Transit System (NTS) has partnered with Rio Hondo College to provide transportation services to students through the GO RIO program. GO RIO has facilitated increased access to public transportation for students commuting to and from Rio Hondo College. Moreover, NTS utilizes clean technology buses which means these students are doing their part to reduce traffic congestion and air pollution in the southeast Los Angeles County region.

NTS buses used for the GO RIO program are powered by cutting edge Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) technology buses. Not only will NTS be helping to introduce more full-time students to mass transit, but it will be simultaneously raising awareness of alternative fuel technology.

The Go Rio program has incorporated the University Pass (U-Pass), which is a sticker placed on Rio Hondo student IDs to be used in lieu of cash fare. This sticker includes a smart chip to enable students to tap the farebox on board to receive a

free ride for commuting to and from school. The Go Rio U-Pass/Sticker is now valid for use on NTS on Saturday and Sunday.

Reload TAP Cards on Norwalk Transit Buses

Norwalk Transit System (NTS) passengers can now add funds to their Transit Access Pass (TAP Card) at the farebox on-board the bus. The TAP card can be utilized to pay the fare on NTS buses, as well as twenty-four (24) other transit agencies in the LA County region. Patrons can re-use and re-load their card as Stored Value (cash value).

Reloading your TAP card is easy! Simply:

- 1. Board the front of the bus and tell the operator that you would like to add Stored Value (cash) to your TAP card. Please note TAP cards can also be purchased on all buses for \$2.
- 2. Wait for the driver to press a button on the farebox.
- 3. Tap your card on the farebox.
- 4. When the green indicator light comes on, put your money in the farebox, then tap your card again.

carts or dumped out in the street or alley. Bring your old, unwanted e-waste for recycling and up to five boxes of documents for secure shredding on site.

That same day, the City in partnership with the Norwalk Library, will be sponsoring a Rain Barrel Distribution event from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Norwalk Library parking lot, located at 12350 Imperial Highway. Rain barrels can be used to collect and reuse rain water to irrigate landscaping while reducing the amount of drinking (or potable) water used. We encourage you to purchase rain barrels in advance at www.rainbarrelsintl.com under the events tab. Only rain barrels purchased in advance are guaranteed to be available for pick up. Rain barrels sold at the event on first come, first served basis.

Barrels are \$65 plus tax at time of purchase; but are only \$30 plus tax after a \$35 rebate! There is a max of two rain barrel rebates per household and they must be submitted in one single application.

Save Money in the Kitchen


There's something heating up in the kitchen and it's not just food. Your kitchen appliances might be burning more energy than necessary causing your electric bill to rise. Southern California Edison offers these tips to help reduce energy consumption in the kitchen.

Refrigerator – Check and clean the coils regularly, especially during or after the summer. The hot weather makes your refrigerator work harder to keep cool. Also, make sure the door seals are air tight. You can check this by closing a piece of paper in the door, if the paper pulls out easily it may be time to make adjustments. If the seals aren't air tight, cool air can leak out causing your refrigerator to use more energy.

Dishwashers – Save energy when washing dishes by only running full loads. Save even more by turning off the dishwasher after the final rinse and let your dishes air dry. This easy step can reduce your energy use by 40%!

Electric Stoves – Save energy when cooking simply by not using the stove (at least not every day). Microwaves, slow cookers, toaster ovens and electric skillets can be used to cook your meals and use less energy than the stove.

Our community will be able to enjoy a new cardio stepper machine, elliptical and a multi-functional crunch machine. Equipment installation is expected to be completed by late October, 2018.

The equipment was funded by monies received from Caltrans for park improvements due to the construction of the I-5 freeway that impacted Sara Mendez Park.



SHAKE OUT 2018

On Thursday, October 18 at 10:18 a.m., City staff will be participating in the Great California ShakeOut, an earthquake preparedness activity practicing "Drop, Cover, and Hold On," the most common and recommended way to protect oneself during an earthquake. We encourage all residents and businesses to participate in this statewide drill at their homes/facilities.

During an earthquake, you may only have seconds to protect yourself before strong shaking knocks you down -- or drops something on you. Most earthquake-related injuries and deaths are caused by collapsing walls and roofs, flying glass and falling objects. However, it is extremely important for a person to move as little as possible to reach a safe place because most injuries occur when people try to move more than a short distance during the shaking.

Look around you now to identify safe places such as under a sturdy piece of furniture or against an interior wall in your home, office or school so that when shaking starts you can respond quickly. An immediate response to move to a safe place can save lives.

On the day of the drill or during an actual earthquake, if you are inside a building, move no more than a few steps, then:

DROP to the ground (before the earthquake drops you!), Take COVER by getting under a sturdy desk or table, and

HOLD ON to it until the shaking stops.

Stay indoors until the shaking stops and you are sure it is safe to exit. In most buildings in California, you are safer if you stay where you are until the shaking stops.

If you are outdoors when the shaking starts, you should find a clear spot away from buildings, trees, streetlights, and power lines, then Drop, Cover and Hold On. Stay there until the shaking stops.

If you are driving, pull over to a clear location, stop and stay there with your seatbelt fastened until the shaking stops. Once the shaking stops, proceed with caution and avoid bridges or ramps that might have been damaged.
