# Fireworks Safety and Regulations



As we approach the Fourth of July festivities, the City of Norwalk wants to remind residents to respectfully enjoy the holiday by using safe and sane fireworks. The City has a zero tolerance policy for illegal fireworks and will seek maximum penalties for any and all violations.

### **ADDITIONALLY:**

- No one shall possess fireworks at any time other than the hours of 10 a.m. July 1st through 10 p.m. July 4th
- Fireworks are prohibited from being discharged on any days other than July 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th between the hours of 10 a.m. and 10 p.m.
- You must be 18 years of age or older to purchase fireworks. Those under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a responsible person 21 years of age or older.
- No minor under the age of 18 shall possess, fire, set off, discharge, or use any fireworks unless they are physically supervised by a person over the age of 21.


Individuals will be held accountable for the discharge, possession, storage, and sales of dangerous (illegal) fireworks on property they own, rent, lease, or are in immediate control of and subject to fines of up to \$1.500 for the first violation.



## Norwalk Recognized for Financial Reporting; Passes Fiscal Year 19-20 Balanced Budget

The City of Norwalk has been recognized by the Government Finance Officers Association with the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for its 2018 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

The recognition is the highest level of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting.

In addition, the City adopted a \$151.7 million balanced budget for Fiscal Year 19-20. The upcoming fiscal year budget places emphasis on street improvement projects, public safety, and business development.

# Holiday Schedule: Street Sweeping & **Trash Pick Up**

In observance of Independence Day, street sweeping or trash collection will not take place on Thursday, July 4. When there is no street sweeping, it will NOT be made up; however, trash collection WILL be made up. Trash will be collected the day after the normal collection day for the remainder of the week. For example, Thursday's trash will be collected on Friday.

Parking enforcement will continue through the week (with the exception of the listed holiday).

## **Important:**

The altered schedule may cause trash collection to be on the same day as street sweeping in some areas. During these times, please place trash barrels up on the parkway (grass between sidewalk and street) to allow the sweeper to properly clean the street.

# **New Bicycle Lockers at Metrolink Station**

New and improved bike lockers have been installed and are available to rent at the Norwalk/Santa Fe Springs Metrolink Station. There are a total of eight lockers on the east and west side of the station.

The bicycle lockers were purchased with Federal Transit Administration funds and are highly durable, and feature plenty of room to store gear such as lights, gloves, reflective vests and helmets. Moreover, unlike the former lockers made of solid material, the new lockers feature perforated walls and doors you can see through, to discourage usage for personal storage. Please note units shall be able to house only one bicycle per locker.

Fees for bike locker rentals are \$24 for a minimum of six months plus a \$20 refundable security lock deposit. Interested commuters may contact Transit Customer Service staff at 562-929-5550 to confirm availability and request a Bicycle Locker Agreement for completion. ## **Come and Experience** Program Enhancements at the Senior Center



During the June 18 City Council meeting, the Norwalk City Council approved program enhancements at the Senior Center to safeguard the health and safety of Norwalk's senior population.

Since 1984, the Los Angeles County Workforce Development, Aging Community Services (WDACS) has provided funding for a home delivery program, also known as the Senior Nutrition Program, which includes daily meal service at the Social Services and Senior Centers, as well as delivery to homebound residents. Meal services had been contracted to outside agencies but following Council direction, Senior Center staff reviewed the program to identify service and quality alternatives. To enhance services and ensure the program best meet the needs of our seniors, an agreement was approved establishing the Senior Center's direct oversight of the program and day to day operations.

In addition, an agreement was approved with WDACS and the County of Los Angeles Area Agency on Aging (AAA) for funding of the Supportive Services Program (SSP). The program is designed to help Norwalk seniors live independently and avoid premature institutionalization. In-home services, including homemaking, personal care, and case management are provided to frail, elderly individuals, 60 and older living in Norwalk. The program provides assistance to approximately 50-55 seniors per fiscal year.

## **Social Services Center Earns Prestigious Recognition**

The program also provides lodging vouchers to individuals and families, who are temporarily displaced and in need of emergency lodging. Preventing homelessness is the key feature of this program.
