On August 1, 2019, Norwalk Transit System (NTS) celebrated its 45th anniversary. As a municipal transit agency serving the City of Norwalk and surrounding cities of Artesia, Bellflower, Cerritos, El Monte, La Habra, La Mirada, Santa Fe Springs, South El Monte, Whittier and unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County, NTS has accomplished a great deal over the past four decades. Here are just some of their many achievements.

- **1974** The Norwalk Transit System (NTS) began as a municipal operation.
  - Demand-responsive transit service (DAR) for people with physical disabilities was initiated.
- **1995** NTS implemented bus-rail shuttle service with the opening of the Metro Green Line I-105/I-605 Studebaker Station in Norwalk (for direct access to the Norwalk/Santa Fe Springs Transportation Center and Metrolink service).
- **1996** NTS implemented taxicab voucher service for DAR patrons who had transportation needs during the evening hours.
- Held Grand Opening for the Transportation/Public Services Facility that features a 20,639 sq. ft. three-story building, a 15,680 sq. ft. maintenance facility and a 31,334 sq. ft. Public Services building complete with a storage warehouse. The main lobby, Customer Service Center and Dispatch Center occupy the first floor. The Public Services Department's Administration division operates on the second floor with the Transportation Administration division occupying the third floor.
  - NTS launches Stuff-A-Bus Toy Drive.
- **2006** Bus Stop Improvement Program Phase I was completed, transforming original bus stops with new benches, signs and shelters, incorporating a new distinct NTS logo.
- 2007 NTS assumes Whittier's bus Routes 1 & 2 and integrates them as Route 6 and 7.
  - NTS incorporates Metro's bus line 275 into Route 8.
- NTS implements the Transit Access Pass (TAP), which replaces Metrocards and allows passengers to add cash value to the pass.
- NTS purchases fourteen Gillig Low Floor, Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) buses.
  - NTS re-designs its branding and logo and decals all buses with the new design scheme.
  - Completed construction of a complete CNG Refueling Station.
- Implemented a complete upgrade of the Transportation/Public Services
  Facility including reconstruction of the entrance via Imperial Hwy., to
  provide a direct, safe and continuous pedestrian walkway and bicycle pathway.
  Construction of a pedestrian plaza at the Metrolink Station parking lot. Installation
  of Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras around entire site, as well as additional,
  improved lighting. Improvements to the Customer Service Center lobby and Equipment
  Maintenance Division, including a new bus wash station, new bus lift and
  reconstruction of storekeeper area and parts room.
- NTS assumes operation of the northern segment of Metro's line 270, connecting the El Monte Bus Station to the Norwalk Green Line Station. This new service becomes
- Began design and implementation of the Intelligent Transportation System to include automatic vehicle location, automated passenger counting, GPS based computer automated dispatch, and automated travel information system for all fixed-route buses.

NTS continues to strive for excellence as a regional resource for public transportation and supporter of our community's mobility needs. Through the years, NTS has met these needs by expanding routes and transit services. As the City of Norwalk celebrates this historic milestone, its leaders, the community, and transportation staff are looking forward to see what lies ahead in the next 45 years.

Rain barrels help by collecting water that would otherwise be lost to runoff. Water collected in a rain barrel can then be used to water your yards and gardens. An added bonus is that rainwater is actually better for plants

because it's free from added chemicals, such as chlorine and fluoride!

The City of Norwalk has partnered with conserve our resources Golden State Water and Liberty Utilities for a Rain Barrel Distribution and Workshop on Saturday, September 14 at City Hall, 12700 Norwalk Blvd.

Rain barrels can be purchased for the discounted rate of \$20 plus tax, two max per household, and picked up from City Hall on September 14. Residents can also participate in a free workshop, covering topics such as the installation of a rain barrel and water conservation techniques.
