

Each family received various food/restaurant gift cards, uniform clothing, socks and backpacks filled with school supplies for the children. Norwalk Makes History with Social Media Takeover

With the 2020 Census count concluding soon, the City of Norwalk and the U.S. Census Bureau partnered on a social media takeover. As a first of its kind, the dynamic campaign took place across Twitter, Facebook and Instagram. Making history, Norwalk was the first municipality to partner with the U.S. Census Bureau on a social media campaign.

On Wednesday, August 12, photos and video were posted on all three platforms every hour from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. with live stories

taking place from the Norwalk Senior Center and Social Services Center.

The goal of the campaign was to increase engagement, especially in the younger demographic, who may be completing the survey for the first time. Residents were encouraged to like, share or comment on posts for opportunities to receive prizes. Census Bureau staff selected the lucky winners and prizes were delivered to homes. The campaign resulted in a very enthusiastic response

from residents and many expressed their thanks on the fun way to get people involved.

Helping our Businesses Thrive

As part of our efforts to assist our business community during COVID-19, the City of Norwalk has expanded its Temporary Outdoor Business Program. Initially, the program allowed restaurants to apply for permits to conduct their operations outdoors, but an updated LA County Health



Department order allowed for other qualifying business, including fitness centers and personal grooming services, to apply.

Safely Disposing of Household Hazardous Waste

These events had been discontinued temporarily due to COVID-19, but resumed recently, with extra safety precautions.

Our dedicated Homeless Operation Prevention and Engagement (HOPE) team is still actively providing services to those in need, while also working to keep our public areas safe and clean. The HOPE team coordinates with partner agencies from the State and County, along with local non-profit organizations to offer a range of housing and service options to individuals experiencing homelessness. They also address public blight and potential health hazards by keeping streets, alleys, railroads, riverbeds and parks free from encampments and debris.



Following the birth of their second child, William, in 1947, the family moved to San Francisco where George trained at the seminary. After his graduation, he ministered in Williams in northern California. In the early 1950s, the Halseys arrived in

88 King Chinese Fast Food & Donut:

An Early Recipient of Norwalk's Economic Recovery Stimulus Program



To help our business community prosper under COVID-19, we launched the Economic Recovery Stimulus Program. One of the first recipients of a loan was 88 King Chinese Fast Food & Donut located at 16441 Pioneer Boulevard. We talked with them about their history and how Norwalk's loan program is assisting the local business.

In 2004, the Tran family opened 88 King Chinese Fast Food & Donut to serve the Norwalk community. Reflecting the story of many other small businesses, the Tran family had relied on take-out and catering, but both have drastically decreased due to COVID-19. They have found themselves having to reduce part time staff hours and dealt with the loss of a vendor who closed up. Despite these difficulties, the Tran family see themselves as part of the community and have been committed to providing their customers with quality food at the same prices.

The Tran family learned of Norwalk's Economic Recovery Stimulus Program through a flyer and immediately looked into the program.

"The application was easy and process was relatively quick. Maribel Medina [City of Norwalk employee] was helpful in explaining the process," said Mike Tran. "Altogether, it took about one month from application to notification of funding."

88 King Chinese Fast Food received \$4,022 to utilize for rent assistance.

The City of Norwalk's Economic Recovery Stimulus Program has been made possible by utilizing Community Development Block Grant funds granted through the CARES Act. Business loans are available for up to \$35,000 to help pay lease/rent, utilities or purchase supplies to help slow the spread of COVID-19. The loans are eligible to be forgiven.

To date, we have a received over 70 applications. We are proud to share that more than 15 businesses have been approved for funding with other applications in different stages of review.

Disasters Don't Wait. Make Your Plan Today.

September is National Preparedness Month. Take this time to take steps to prepare for emergencies in your homes, businesses, schools and communities. As our nation continues to respond to COVID-19, there is no better time to be involved this September.

Week 1, September 1-5: Make A Plan

Talk to your friends and family about how you will communicate before, during, and after a disaster. Make sure to update your plan based on the Centers for Disease Control recommendations due to the coronavirus.

Week 2, September 6-12: Build a Kit



Gather supplies that will last for several days after a disaster for everyone living in your home. Don't forget to consider the unique needs each person or pet may have in case you have to evacuate quickly. Update your kits and supplies based on recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control.

Week 3, September 13-19: Prepare for Disasters

Limit the impacts that disasters have on you and your family. Know the risk of disasters in your area and check your insurance coverage. Learn how to make your home stronger in the face of storms and other common hazards and act fast if you receive a local warning or alert.

Week 4, September 20-26: Teach Youth about Preparedness

Talk to your kids about preparing for emergencies and what to do in case you are separated. Reassure them by providing information about how they can get involved

Don't Dump: Athens Pickups



Illegal dumping is the disposal of unwanted trash and or bulky items in places that they do not belong. We want to encourage residents to report illegal dumping to our Public Safety Department by calling 562-929-5732. Unreported illegal dumping results in more abandoned items as individuals may keep returning to the same locations to

continue dumping. This causes an endless cycle of dumping, with unsightly trash, debris, and garbage bringing blight to our neighborhoods. You can also call Athens at 1-855-557-1007 to schedule pick up of any unwanted bulky items you want to dispose of or to report illegally dumped trash and garbage on your property or around your neighborhood.

When to Call LASD vs Public Safety

Public Safety's role in the community is to address non-life-threatening quality of life issues. We respond to your requests regarding parking enforcement, general safety concerns and provide community outreach.

The City of Norwalk contracts with the Norwalk Sheriff's Station for policing services. Sheriff Deputies respond to emergency situations and traffic collisions.

SCAM

The City of Norwalk Public Safety Department would like to warn residents of a recent trend of scammers posing as Southern California Edison (SCE) employees. Scammers are calling residents claiming to be "collection" employees and often threatening to shut off electricity services unless an immediate payment is made. Here are some things to keep in mind if you receive a call from someone claiming to be an Edison employee:

- SCE will never demand credit card information over the phone
- SCE does not accept pre-paid visa cards as form of payment
- SCE will not remove your meter
- SCE does not have a Disconnection Department

Don't fall victim to this or any other scams. If you have any questions regarding your utility services, always contact the service provider directly.

Holiday Trash & Street Sweeping Schedule



In observance of Labor Day, there will be no street sweeping or trash collection on Monday, September 7. When there is no street sweeping, it will NOT be made up. Streets can only be swept on the posted day. However, trash collection WILL be made up. Trash will be collected the day after the

normal collection day for the remainder of the week. For example, Monday's trash will be collected on Tuesday.

Important:

The altered schedule may cause trash collection to be on the same day as street sweeping in some areas. During these times, please place trash & recycle containers up on the parkway (grass between sidewalk and street) to allow the sweeper to properly clean the street. We appreciate your efforts in keeping the streets safe and clean by ensuring trash cans do not interfere with sweeping.
