Governor Newsom's Emergency Powers Affect Norwalk

the City of Norwalk with its "emergency powers" in their response to challenges created by COVID-19.

In April, Los Angeles County made efforts to temporarily place people experiencing homelessness, considered vulnerable to COVID-19, at the Saddleback Motel in Norwalk. On September 10th, the Department of State Hospitals (DSH) informed Norwalk residents of its intent to renovate and possibly house COVID-19 negative patients at the California Youth Authority (CYA) facility located on Bloomfield Avenue. Now, Los Angeles County officials have informed the City of its intent to purchase the Motel

For the third time in six months, the State of California has targeted 6 on Rosecrans Avenue, as part of Governor Newsom's Project Homekey. Unfortunately, the City has no legal recourse to prevent the State from exercising its "emergency powers."



In response, the City Council has made the following attempts to address these issues with both state and county officials:

- In April, the City Council voted unanimously to impose a temporary ban to prevent motel conversions for Project Roomkey without prior City approval.
- In July, the City Council unanimously passed an emergency ordinance that requires any public agency to consult with the City prior to placing a homeless or COVID-19 facility in Norwalk.
- In September, City officials met with representatives at Metropolitan State Hospital and DSH to arrange a town hall meeting to ensure residents were fully informed regarding their plans for possibly re-opening of the CYA facility.
- Last week, in response to the County's efforts to purchase Motel 6 on Rosecrans Avenue, the City informed County officials regarding the negative impact on Norwalk resources such action would have. The City recommended the County cease their efforts in purchasing the hotel for that purpose.

The City of Norwalk has always been a willing participant in doing its fair share in its fight against homelessness. The City's own homelessness taskforce has directly contributed to the rapid decrease in the latest homeless count by the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority.

In order to keep residents informed of the CYA facility, the City has requested an additional town hall meeting on October 8, 2020, from 6 pm to 7 pm. 




Assisting Those in Need, Keeping **Community Safe**

The City of Norwalk is committed to ensuring the health and safety of our community for a high quality of life. Like most cities throughout our state, homelessness has been a critical issue in Norwalk. In 2018, the City released an Adopted Homeless Plan recognizing the need for a strategic approach to meet the needs of the homeless community and residents. The plan serves as a guide to address homelessness with ethical policies and a team of knowledgeable individuals who connect individuals to resources.

Despite the impacts brought by COVID-19, our City Council remains dedicated to addressing this issue by allocating staff and resources, including \$345,000.

Through our Homeless Operation Prevention and Engagement (HOPE) team, the City continues to actively provide services to people experiencing homelessness, while working to keep areas safe and clean. The HOPE team removes transient encampments on a daily basis, and monitors these locations in order to provide resources and deter individuals from returning. In addition, the Public Safety and Public Services Departments continue to promptly respond to illegal dumping, vandalism and nuisance activity that may contribute to camp sites.

During these unprecedented times, it is important as a community to stay connected and help each other, especially our seniors. To help facilitate assistance and communication between residents, the City of Norwalk is introducing the Connect, Call, and Care Community Program. Residents can request a "Connected Community" packet for themselves, a neighbor or a loved one. These packets include three 11" x 17" color cards. Seniors will be advised to place the appropriate card in a window so that their neighbors know how they are doing. If neighbors are unable to help at that moment, they can call the Norwalk Senior Center and staff will follow up with the senior.

These cards are for non-emergencies.

- · Green: Indicates that the senior is doing well and does not require assistance.
- · Yellow: Indicates that the senior has a non-urgent matter and may need some help in resolving it.

Example: "I'm feeling very isolated and can use someone to

 Red: Indicates the senior has an urgent, non-emergency matter and will need assistance to resolve the issue soon. Example: "I am running low on food and have no way to go grocery shopping."

Great Shake Out 2020

On Thursday, October 15, 2020, at 10:15 a.m., the City will be participating in the Great ShakeOut, the world's largest earthquake drill, practicing "**DROP**, **COVER**, and **HOLD ON**," the recommended technique to protect oneself during an earthquake. We encourage all residents and businesses to participate in this nation-wide drill at their homes and facilities.

- During an earthquake, you may only have seconds to protect yourself before strong shaking knocks you down -- or drops something on you. Most earthquake-related injuries are caused by falling and flying objects, so once the shaking starts, it is extremely important that you move as little as possible, reach a safe place as quickly as possible, and take cover wherever and however you can.
- Look around you now to identify safe places to take cover, such as under a sturdy piece of furniture in your home, office or school, so that when an earthquake happens, you can respond quickly. Also, keep an eye out for hazards like objects hanging from walls or heavy, unsecured items like bookcases and file cabinets.

On the day of the drill or during an actual earthquake, if you are inside a building: **DROP** to the ground (before the earthquake drops you!), Take **COVER** by getting under a sturdy desk or table, and **HOLD ON** to it until the shaking stops.

Stay indoors until the shaking stops and you are sure it is safe to exit. In most buildings in California, you are safer if you stay where you are until the earthquake is over.

If you are outdoors when the shaking starts, you should find a clear spot away from buildings, trees, streetlights and power lines, then **DROP** to the ground and **COVER** your head and neck with your arms. Stay there until the shaking stops.

If you are driving, pull over to a clear location, stop and stay there with your seatbelt fastened until the shaking stops. Once the shaking stops, proceed with caution and avoid bridges or ramps that might have been damaged.

Stay Vigilant to Prevent Auto Theft

Most vehicle break-ins occur because perpetrators see an opportunity. Do not give them any reason to believe they can make you a victim!

It is a common tactic for thieves to walk through neighborhoods checking doors of vehicles to see if they were left unlocked. Once they find a vehicle that is unlocked, it only takes them moments to take valuables or even personal documents.

By taking these following steps, you may prevent your vehicle from falling victim to theft:

- Do not leave your key inside the vehicle, even if it is not in plain sight.
- Never leave your vehicle running or unattended.
 - Park in well-lit areas whenever possible.
 - Never leave valuables in your vehicle.
 - Make sure every door is locked, windows are rolled up, and the alarm is set before you walk away

Station to report the activity at 562-863-8711.

Internet Safety Tips

Due to recent distance learning a higher number of youth are using the internet. Whether they are checking their emails or social media accounts, now more than ever before, our youth are online. We would like to remind parents to stay vigilant and discuss internet safety. If not properly supervised, children are vulnerable to social engineering scams, and potentially being conned into revealing sensitive information about themselves and family, or even sharing compromising photographs of themselves. Below are some tips to protect your child from becoming a victim.

- Speak to your child, no matter their age, about internet safety.
- Review applications on their phone that request access to their photos, videos, and messaging capabilities
- Make sure you have privacy settings so that applications and websites are scanned
- Monitor your child's internet; keep devices in an open, common room of the house. Contact your internet service provider to learn how to enable parental controls
- Check your child's social media accounts to ensure they are not sharing personal information such as address, phone number, or any other private information
- Make sure children know that anyone who asks a child to engage in sexually explicit activity online should be reported to a parent, guardian, or other trusted adult and law enforcement.

These items can be placed in your green waste containers:

Branches Leaves Flowers

Tree trimmings Brush Untreated lumber, scrap wood & plywood

The following items should not be placed green waste containers. Rather, they should be disposed of in your black trash containers.

Rocks & Dirt Pet Waste Bird of Paradise or Palm Fronds Foam

WHY? Unfortunately, these items cannot be reused as compost. What's worse? By placing these items in your green waste containers, the entire load may be considered contaminated.

Scholarship Opportunities

Are you considering a career change? Now, may be a great time to explore technical training. The City of Norwalk recognizes the importance of education and training in building successful futures. To assist our community secure stable incomes, we are offering scholarships to assist low income residents with the cost of tuition in health sciences and medical technology or welding/metal fabrication. Training is offered through the Norwalk-La Mirada Adult School (NLMAS) with funding provided by the Community Development Block Grant program.

The City will pay for the cost of tuition (class fees), and depending upon the program, the amount of assistance ranges from \$1,000 to \$2,600. The student is responsible for the cost of books, uniforms, background checks, and/or exams. Funding for the program is limited.

To qualify:

You must be a Norwalk resident. Proof of residency is required.

You must be 18 years of age or older.

You must submit a completed application and essay.

Your total combined household income cannot exceed the following income limits

Para ayudar a nuestra comunidad a asegurar ingresos estables, ofrecemos becas para ayudar a los residentes de bajos ingresos con el costo de la matrícula en ciencias de la salud, tecnología médica o soldadura / fabricación de metales. La capacitación se ofrece a través de la Escuela de Adultos de Norwalk-La Mirada (NLMAS). Las becas ayudaran con el costo de la matrícula y, dependiendo en el programa, la cantidad de asistencia varía entre \$\$1,000 y \$\$2,600. El estudiante es responsable del costo de los libros, uniformes y exámenes.
