

COVID-19 SPECIAL COVERAGE . Safer at Home







Emergency powers are given to a public authority, under extreme circumstances, to be used in the best interest of the people. In our country, in most states, this power is given to the governor by law—and in some cases, for a limited time.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Newsom declared a State of Emergency. Shortly thereafter, he cited several government codes that gave him the authority to do so. In particular, section 8627, which says that during a State of Emergency, the governor has complete authority over all state agencies, the right to exercise police powers, and the ability to issue and enforce orders "as he deems necessary." Under normal conditions this may result in a conflict with other government agencies. However, during a State of Emergency, it is considered by many within the powers of the Governor to exercise such powers.

How does this affect Norwalk? During the last six months, the State has exercised these emergency powers, with no prior authorization from Norwalk officials, in three separate topics.

These actions include:

- The placing of persons experiencing homelessness, considered vulnerable to the coronavirus at the Saddleback Hotel on Firestone Boulevard.
- The Department of State Hospitals intent to renovate and possibly house COVID-19 negative patients at the California Youth Authority facility located on Bloomfield Avenue.
- · Los Angeles County officials intent to purchase the Motel 6 on Rosecrans Avenue as part of Governor Newsom's Project Homekey to permanently house people experiencing homelessness.

The Norwalk City Council has made extensive efforts to inform residents regarding these decisions by the State. The City has made requests to both the State and County officials for input on how these decisions may potentially affect Norwalk.

The City will continue to inform residents on these and any possible future decisions by the State.

COVID-19 UPDATELA County Reopening Protocols

Most recently, the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health (County) has issued reopening protocols for several sectors, including nail salons and indoor shopping malls. Per the County:

Nail Salons

- Effective October 1, 2020, indoor services can resume at 25% occupancy. Salons are encouraged to continue outdoor services.
- Employees and customers screened for symptoms, and physical distancing measures are in place.
- Magazines, coffee and other amenities are removed. Contactless payment systems are encouraged.

School Waivers

- Effective October 5, 2020, schools with transitional kindergarten 2nd grade programs can apply for waivers for in-person instruction.
- The issuance of waivers will be prioritized to schools with higher percentages of students qualified for free/reduced meals.
- · Limit to 30 schools per week.

Indoor Shopping Malls

- Effective October 7, 2020, retail shops inside indoor malls with no outside
- Food courts are open for take out only. Indoor dining and all common areas remain closed.
- Contactless payment systems are encouraged.

Breweries/Wineries

- May operate outdoors and offer sit-down dining with permitted caterer, restaurant or food truck.
- Alcohol must be purchased in the same transaction as a bona fide meal.
- Face coverings and social distancing are required at all locations.



Holiday Trash & Street Sweeping Schedule



In observance of Veterans Day on November 11, there will be no street sweeping; however, trash collection will take place.

Likewise, there will be service interruptions for the Thanksgiving holiday. There will be no street sweeping or trash

collection on Thursday, November 26. Trash collection will resume on Friday, November 27, but street sweeping will not resume until Monday, November 30.

As a reminder, when there is no street sweeping, it will NOT be made up. Streets can only be swept on the posted day. However, trash collection WILL be made up. Trash will be collected the day after the normal collection day for the remainder of the week. For example, Thursday's trash will be collected on Friday.

Important:

The altered schedule may cause trash collection to be on the same day as street sweeping in some areas. During these times, please place trash and recycle containers up on the parkway (grass between sidewalk and street) to allow the sweeper to properly clean the street. We appreciate your efforts in keeping the streets safe and clean by ensuring trash cans do not interfere with sweeping.

The Public Safety Department will no longer be issuing parking citations for street sweeping on any day where trash collection and street sweeping take place on the same day, as sometimes occurs following some holidays. For example, if an observed holiday falls on a Monday, and creates a one-day delay in trash collection, then street sweeping enforcement will be exempt the rest of the week. Please note ONLY the days following the below holidays will be exempted from enforcement.

Holidays observed include:

Thanksgiving Day - Thursday, November 27 Christmas Day - Friday, December 25 New Year's Day - Friday, January 1

Reminder: On regularly scheduled trash collection day, residents are requested to place their trash and recycle bins at the curb for disposal up to 24 hours before the day of collection and must be removed and properly stored away from public view by 6 a.m. the following designated collection day. When trash collection occurs on the same day as street sweeping, bins should be placed on the parkway/on top of the curb so that street sweeping activity may take place.



Vehicle Thefts

Vehicle thefts continue to be on the rise in our community and the City does not want to see you fall victim to these thieves. Vehicle thefts can happen anywhere at any time. Never give thieves

the incentive to target your vehicle. Here are some tips to ensure the safe keeping of your vehicles:

- Utilize a steering wheel lock or other owner applied anti-theft device.
- If feasible, keep your vehicle in your driveway or garage to deter a possible theft.
- Consider installing an anti-theft device such as an alarm system, or GPS tracking device.
- Place anti-theft stickers on the windows.

If you do fall victim to vehicle theft, call the Norwalk Sheriff's Station at 562-863-8711 as soon as possible. When reporting a stolen vehicle, make sure you have the license plate and vehicle identification number (also known as VIN) so that your vehicle can be entered into the Stolen Vehicle System.

Norwalk, like surrounding communities, is experiencing an increase in catalytic converter thefts. Please follow the below simple tips to deter thieves targeting your vehicles.



- 2. Park trucks or SUV's surrounded by low ground clearance vehicles.
- 3. If your catalytic converter is a bolt-on model, have the bolts welded shut.
- 4. Install a catalytic converter protection device that clamps around the converter.
- 5. Etch your converter with your vehicle's license plate number in several locations.

Credit Card Scam Alert

The Public Safety Department would like to warn residents of an ongoing scam that seeks to steal your money. Scammers are disguising themselves as legitimate credit bureau companies offering reimbursement for being a victim of a data breach. Be aware that these are fake scammers looking to take your money.

If you receive an email or phone call advising that you have fallen victim to a data breach, do not provide them with any personal information until you verify the notice is valid. You will never have to pay to claim these benefits and anyone who tries to get you to file a claim is most likely a scammer.

Litter & Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping damages neighborhoods, ruins the beautiful views of our City, threatens the environment, and is against the law. The Norwalk Municipal Code 8.28.040 prohibits depositing litter upon any street/sidewalk/public place. The California Penal Code 374.4 makes illegal dumping on private and public property punishable by a fine of up to \$10,000, and/or up to six months in jail. If you witness illegal dumping in progress, report it by calling the Public Safety Department at 562-929-5732. When reporting illegal dumping, provide as much detail as possible (date, location, time, vehicle color, make, clothing details).

How to Properly Dispose Items

- Property owners are responsible for properly disposing of all of their waste. Leaving trash and discarded items in alleys, medians and other public spaces not only reflects an unsightly appearance, but also creates community health and safety hazards.
- Please be reminded that residents of single-family homes may pre-arrange collection of up to FIVE bulky items once a week at no additional charge by calling Athens Services. To request a bulky item pick up, contact Athens Services at 888-336-6100 or online at athensservices.com/bulky-item-pickup/.

The City also reminds you to please be a courteous neighbor when disposing of landscape debris. Dispose of yard waste and debris appropriately. Do not blow into street; lawn clippings and leaves blown into the street can cause stormwater pollution, by entering into storm drains, clogging the system. Please make sure that your landscape contractor is properly disposing of such debris and not blowing into the street or sidewalk. It is a violation of Norwalk Municipal code 18.04.070, to sweep or blow grass clippings, leaves, and other debris into the street and gutters.

Get Your Rain Barrel!

The City of Norwalk, in partnership with Golden State Water and Liberty Utilities, are sponsoring a Rain Barrel Distribution. Due to COVID-19, the event has been modified and rain barrels will be delivered to homes, rather than residents having to pick up.

Residents MUST pre-order a rain barrel and may do so either by calling 919-602-6316 or visiting rainbarrelsintl.com. The cost of the rain barrel is \$20 plus tax, and there is a max limit of two rain barrels per household. Barrels will be delivered to Norwalk homes on December 1 – 5.

Please note: Households who have purchased two rain barrels at a previous distribution event are not eligible to participate.
