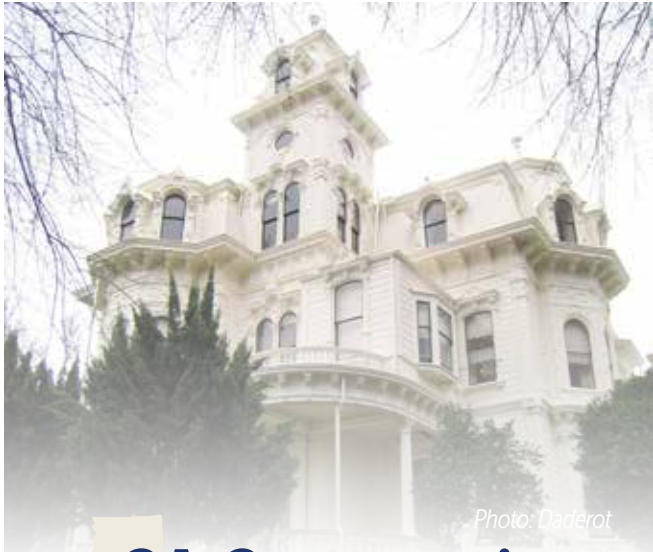

CA Governor's Emergency Powers

Thanks to increased vaccination rates throughout the State, the rate of transmission of the COVID-19 virus is down significantly. As such, Governor Newsom's use of his "emergency powers" may no longer be necessary. The Norwalk City Council has made several efforts to ensure that any State or County action initiated using these powers would not impact Norwalk residents or businesses negatively.

The City has been in communication with several agencies and has discussed the scheduled ending to many of these programs initiated by the State.

- The Metropolitan State Hospital's use of the annex, formerly known as the California Youth Authority facility, is scheduled to end on September 30, 2021.

- In the latest update for the Project Roomkey (PRK) program in Norwalk a — collaborative effort by the state and county to temporarily house those experiencing homelessness during the pandemic, there were a total of 198 rooms being occupied, with a total number of 217 participants. This program is also expected to come to an end by September.

- The Project Homekey (PHK) site in Norwalk has been closed since late March due to a fire that damaged the building. All occupants of the Project Homekey site in Norwalk have been relocated, with some being transferred to other locations in Compton and Long Beach. Before its closure, the City was able to house many of its own homeless population. The County has not indicated when the site may reopen.

The legal challenges to Governor Newsom's use of emergency powers continue. On May 5, 2021, a ruling was made against the plaintiffs fighting the use of these powers at the 3rd District Court of Appeals. The plaintiffs plan to petition the case to the California Supreme Court.

Governor Newsom announced that the State will end the mask mandate after June 15th. Some indoor requirements will likely remain in place.

The City will continue to monitor any new developments regarding these issues and keep residents informed.

New Interim Director of Public Safety, Dennis Kato



The former LAPD Deputy Chief brings a wealth of experience to Norwalk, as he guides the City's Public Safety efforts.

The City of Norwalk made immediate efforts to recruit a replacement for former Director of Public Safety, Grissel Chavez who has moved on to a position with the City of Bell Gardens. As of May 13th, former Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) Deputy Chief Dennis Kato is the new Interim Director of Public Safety.

The Public Safety Department is an essential service provided by the City, so an immediate replacement was crucial, which led to the recruitment of Mr. Kato. He brings with him 32-years of veteran experience with the LAPD. He has worked a variety of assignments such as patrol, gangs, vice, narcotics, burglaries, major assault crimes, and Asian Crimes homicides. He has supervised law enforcement personnel for over 19 years and has been a command officer (captain and above) for over 11 years. As a Deputy Chief, Mr. Kato oversaw a workforce of approximately 1,500 officers and 500 civilian personnel.

As the new Interim Director of Public Safety, Mr. Kato now leads and manages day-to-day operations of the Norwalk Public Safety Department and its staff of 52 employees. Dennis Kato expressed his enthusiasm for the new task when he stated, "I'm grateful and excited for this opportunity. My experience with the LAPD along with my training has provided me with the foundation to lead the many efforts here and to expand on the duties of community policing efforts for Norwalk's growing community."

Mr. Kato has dealt with many intense policing efforts including several experiences of community unrest during his tenure with the LAPD and this has molded and shaped his view of policing and solidified his commitment to the tenets of community policing. This involves fostering trust between the police and the community, while aligning policies with community values and prioritizing community engagement.

Athens and Nationwide Reroute

The City of Norwalk is partnering with Athens Services and Nationwide Environmental Services to update their routing schedule to provide more efficient services to Norwalk residents.

As a reminder, the City has identified multiple areas within city limits that will have both their waste & recycling collection and their street sweeping days changed. These affected residents will receive letters in the mail informing them of these changes.

Additional areas in the City may also note the timeframe for their street sweeping service change. Some areas will have their parking restriction times for street sweeping shortened. The change is expected to

be more convenient for these residents.

The City will have street signs updated in the following weeks reflecting any street sweeping changes. **Please note that your waste & recycling collection and street sweeping schedule, as well as street sweeping times, will remain the same until Monday, August 2, 2021, which will be the implementation date for these changes.**

Homeless Services

The City of Norwalk is committed to helping its homeless population through its Departments of Public Safety and Social Services, which provide and/or help connect Norwalk residents facing homelessness with several outreach and supportive services.



Public Safety: Homeless Task Force

A multi-agency partnership comprised of agencies such as City departments, Los Angeles County Sheriff's, LAHSA, PATH, Kingdom Causes Bellflower, Department of Mental Health, Norwalk Library, LA CADA, and more. The agencies focus on collaborative efforts to assist those in need in a variety of ways.

Homeless Operation Prevention & Engagement (HOPE)

Responds to resident and business concerns, while addressing encampments, in accordance with the law. The HOPE team also conducts outreach to those experiencing homelessness and connects those in need with necessary resources.

Social Services:

Emergency Assistance Program:

Provides rent arrears, utility assistance, and motel vouchers for those in need.

211 LA:

The central source for providing information and referrals for all health and human services in L.A. County. The 2-1-1 phone line is open 24/7, with trained Community Resource Advisors prepared to offer help with any situation.

Jovenes:

They help youth, ages 18-25, end their cycle of homelessness by working to develop pathways for personal and professional growth so young people can move into permanent housing and make meaningful contributions to the community. For more information, please call: 323-260-8035

Kingdom Causes Bellflower:

Career Technical Training Scholarships



The City of Norwalk has scholarships available to assist low income residents with the cost of technical training in health sciences and medical technology or welding/metal fabrication. The

training is offered through the Norwalk-La Mirada Adult School (NLMAS) with funding provided by the Community Development Block Grant program. Applications will be available starting June 1, 2021. To obtain an application, visit the City of Norwalk's website at:

The City will pay for the cost of tuition (class fees). Depending upon the program, the amount of assistance ranges from \$1,050 to \$2,600. The student is responsible for the cost of books, uniforms, background checks, and/or exams. Funding for the program is

- You must be a Norwalk resident.
- Proof of residency is required.
- You must be 18 years of age or older.
- You must submit a completed application and essay during the application period.

Fireworks Regulations

The City of Norwalk Public Safety Department wants you and your family to enjoy the 4th of July in a safe and responsible way.

Please note that the City has a ZERO tolerance policy for all illegal fireworks and individuals will be held

accountable for any discharge, possession, storage, or sales of illegal fireworks that occurs on their property. If illegal fireworks are found or used at your residence, you will be considered in violation and subject to fines of up to \$3,000.

Additional Rules & Regulations to Consider:

- You are only allowed to possess fireworks from 10:00 a.m. July 1st through 10:00 p.m. July 4th
- You are only allowed to discharge fireworks on July 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.
- You can only use Safe and Sane fireworks in the City of Norwalk
- Fireworks can only be sold July 1st to July 4th, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m.
- You must be 18 years of age or older to purchase fireworks. Those under the age of 18 must be accompanied by someone 21 years of age or older
- No one under the age of 18 is allowed to possess, fire, set off, discharge, or use any fireworks unless they are physically supervised by someone over the age of 21
- Unsupervised minors who are in possession of fireworks can have their fireworks confiscated by any law enforcement officer or Fire Department employee
- No one is allowed to possess or discharge fireworks on any City property, including City parks, streets, and sidewalks, unless they have been issued a permit

The City of Norwalk is dedicated to the safety of the community and this zero tolerance approach helps ensure that all violators are held accountable.

Fireworks Safety

When using Safe and Sane fireworks this 4th of July holiday, the Public Safety Department would like to provide you with some tips to help ensure your safety.

- Always read and follow directions
- Have an adult present at all times
- Only use fireworks outdoors, away from buildings, vehicles, dry grass and other flammable objects
- Light one firework at a time, then move away quickly
- Make sure bystanders are at a safe distance
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person
- Never alter or take apart any fireworks
- Do not give fireworks to young children under any circumstances
- Have a bucket of water handy for emergencies and douse all misfired or spent fireworks
- Never attempt to re-light or fix malfunctioning fireworks
- Remember: parents are liable for any damage or injuries caused by their children using fireworks

Even Safe and Sane fireworks can cause burns, injuries, and fires. Be safe this holiday season!

Sustainability Corner

Recycling and Organics Recycling Guide for Businesses

AB 827: Educating and Involving Customers to Achieve California's Recycling Goals



Effective July 1, 2020 –

Certain businesses must provide recycling and organics containers at front-of-house to collect waste generated by customers from products they purchase and consume on the premises. These containers must be placed adjacent to trash containers. AB 827 requires collection containers at front-of-house to be visible, easily accessible, and clearly marked. This law targets businesses that sell products meant for immediate consumption. Full-service restaurants do not have to provide properly labeled containers for patrons but must provide properly labeled containers next to trash containers for employees to



separate post-consumer recyclables and organics for customers.

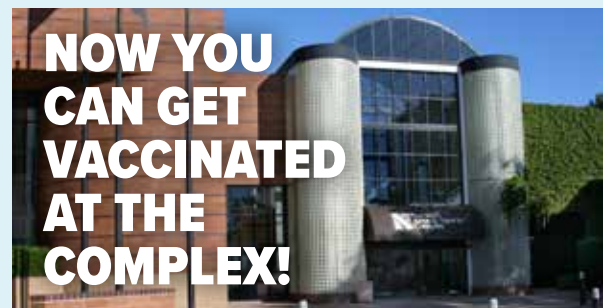

Creative Lil' Tots Program Testimonials

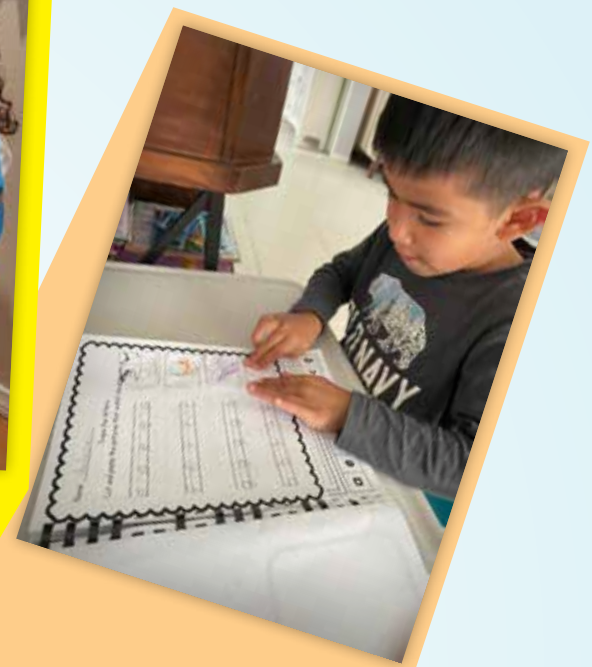
