Norwalk City Council Passes Budget for Fiscal Year 2021/2022



On June 15, 2021, the Norwalk City Council passed the proposed budget for the City's financial plan for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021/2022. The proposed operating budget is balanced with no use of reserves.

The budget includes priorities set by the Council focusing on the City's core services of public safety including homelessness outreach, maintenance of streets and other infrastructure improvements, economic development, and quality of life services. The proposed budget was prepared with an assumption that the City will resume and restore its operations to the pre-COVID-19 status.

The General Fund revenues are projected to increase 2% due to the voter approved Measure P local sales tax and increasing property taxes due to increasing property values.

The budget increases include funding for six full-time positions that had been previously frozen and adds an additional 10 new full-time positions. Newly added positions will primarily enhance services to address homelessness and social assistance needs in the community.

In the hopes of addressing the local homelessness issue, Council made some notable new positions such as a second HOPE team comprised of four full-time positions, and one mid-management position under Public Safety.

The Public Safety General Fund budget includes additional part-time hours for the enhancement of Community Relations, Community Policing, and Code Compliance programs.

Interim Director of Public Safety Dennis Kato worked closely with City administration to address the necessary staff needs for public safety in the community. Mr. Kato is leading the many efforts in the City to expand on the duties of community policing efforts for Norwalk's growing community.

The Public Safety and Social Services Departments will have an overall operating budget increase of 15%.

Emergency Powers



California continues to slowly return to normalcy since the June 15 reopening date due to an increase in vaccination rates throughout the State. However, Gov. Newsom has chosen to retain his use of "emergency powers." As such, the City will continue to monitor any State decisions that may potentially impact the City and its residents.

Updates on some of these State actions are – Project Roomkey (PRK), located at the Saddleback Hotel in Norwalk, which had been in operation in the

City since May 7, 2021. This program temporarily housed people experiencing homelessness who were not COVID-19 positive or symptomatic but were vulnerable to complications associated with the virus. The program is scheduled to end this month and Los Angeles County will be transitioning all the clients out of the Saddleback Hotel location to other shelters and will assist them as needed.

The state-initiated program at the annex, formerly known as the California Youth Authority facility, is still scheduled to come to an end in September 2021. Per the agreement between the City and the Metropolitan State Hospital, the hospital will no longer need to use the facility to temporarily house transitioning patients to its facilities past the planned ending date.

As for the Project Homekey (PHK) site in Norwalk, which is the state's plan to permanently house homeless residents, it will continue to operate as planned. The County owned property is currently being used as a temporary shelter until the program is fully operational. The City will continue to negotiate with the County to transfer people from Norwalk's own homeless population off the streets and into the facility.

The City will continue to monitor any new developments regarding these issues and keep residents informed.

Assistance Available to Residents

The City of Norwalk launched a COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program to mitigate the displacement of Norwalk residents, or those who work in Norwalk, who are experiencing a decrease in household income due to the pandemic and unable to pay their rent, mortgage and/or

To be eligible, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Live or work in the City of Norwalk
- Experiencing a loss of income due to COVID-19
- Not be eligible for or receiving other Federal financial assistance
- Be able to provide a lease agreement or letter confirming tenancy; or able to provide most recent mortgage payment statement issued by mortgage company; and/or most recent utility payment statement issued by utility company
- Have been current on rent, mortgage and/ or utility payments prior to COVID-19
- Make less than 80% of Area Median Income


Street Rehab Project Update

Three contractors were awarded the paving construction for three zones of Phase I of the Local Streets Rehabilitation Program. The work is scheduled in a way that there is no more than one major paving operation occurring at each zone at any given time. However, there may be times that two contractors are within the same zone, but only one major work is in progress.

Mobilization will begin July 19th in Zone 32, where the contractor will be doing some preliminary site preparation. Street work will begin August on Clarkdale Avenue between Alondra Boulevard to 166th Street and will progress from north (Alondra Blvd) towards 166th St within Zone 32, with an estimated completion of early October.

As the work continues in Zone 32, another contractor will begin their preliminary site preparation for Zone 27 and street work will begin August 9th and estimated to be complete by the end of September.

In the midst of the work being done in Zone 32 and Zone 27, the contractor will mobilize towards Zone 24 to begin the street work in mid-August. Construction in Zone 24 is estimated to be completed by the end of September as well.




Shoemaker Avenue Street Improvements

Street improvements are underway on Shoemaker Avenue between Rosecrans Avenue and Firestone Boulevard. Along the west side of the street, the sidewalk has been widened where it was too narrow for passage around the utility poles and new sidewalk has been placed to complete access to the bridge over the I-5 freeway.

Coordination efforts with the contractor and City of Santa Fe Springs for full closure of the bridge are being made to accommodate the construction of the improvements to the existing median island as well as the extensive paving operations along Shoemaker Ave from Firestone Ave and Rosecrans Ave.

The bridge closure is estimated to begin early August and estimated to reopen mid-September. Soon after the completion of the improvements to the existing median island and the street paving, new landscaping will be placed on the median island.



With children returning to in-person classroom learning, Public Safety would like to remind parents to travel safely in school zones. Parents can anticipate congested streets around school zones and are responsible for obeying all traffic laws in these areas at all times.

Common violations include:

- Blocking entrances / driveways
- 25 MPH speed limit in school zones
- Not using pedestrian crossings correctly
- Parking zone restrictions (red curbs, etc.)
- Impeding / blocking traffic
- Loading/unloading passengers from vehicles stopped in the street
- Not wearing seat belts / using improper child restraint systems
- Not yielding to children while crossing
- Passing buses with stop signs displayed

School Loading Zones

We would like to remind residents to be mindful when parking in Loading Zones (painted white curbs) in front of schools. School Loading Zones are intended for loading and unloading only. As families transition into in-classroom learning, we ask everyone to abide by all loading zone regulations to keep everyone safe. Any observed or reported loading zones violations are subject to citation. Thank you for your support and adherence.



Holiday Trash & Street Sweeping Schedule
