

California has seen an increase in COVID-19 related cases but continues to maintain some normalcy since it reopened on June 15, which is thanks in part to an increase in statewide vaccination rates. Governor Newsom has made the decision to continue his use of "emergency powers." The City will thus continue to monitor any State decisions that may potentially impact the City and its residents. Here are updates on some of these actions taken by the State and County.

The State-initiated program at the annex, formerly known as the California Youth Authority facility, is scheduled to come to an end by the end of this month. The Metropolitan State Hospital (MSH) had originally used this facility to temporarily house transitioning patients to its facilities, but the program was no longer

needed given the increase in vaccination rates. The City took several steps to work with the MSH to ensure that the community was not affected by this program.

The Project Homekey (PHK) site in Norwalk, located at the former Motel 6 on Rosecrans Avenue, will continue its operation. PHK is the State's plan to permanently house homeless residents. The property is owned by the County, and it is currently being used as a temporary shelter until the program is fully operational. The City negotiated with the County to transfer people from Norwalk's own homeless population off the streets and into this facility.

The City will continue to monitor any new developments regarding these issues and keep residents informed.

Chipotle is Now Open



The anxiously anticipated opening of Chipotle at Norwalk Fitness Village was Sunday August 22. There was also an official ribbon cutting ceremony Wednesday, August 25 with the Mayor and members of City Council as well as the Norwalk Chamber of Commerce.

This location is unique as it is one of the first of its kind to feature a drive thru **"Chipotlane"** option. Chipotle is located at 12539 Imperial Highway, Ste 103 between Esporta Fitness and Panera Bread.





On August 4, 2021, the City of Norwalk was informed that the Project Roomkey site at the Saddleback Hotel, located at 12500 Firestone Boulevard, was officially closed. The site in Norwalk had been operating since May 7, 2020. The County operated program transitioned all the participants out of the Norwalk hotel location to other shelters. As of August 31, 2021, the Saddleback Hotel has fully reopened and has resumed its operation as a hotel.

Project Roomkey was a State-initiated program that temporarily housed people experiencing homelessness who were not COVID-19 positive or symptomatic but were vulnerable to complications associated with the virus.

In April 2020, L.A. County targeted the Saddleback Hotel to house homeless people considered vulnerable to the COVID-19 virus under emergency powers. This decision to exercise these emergency powers

was made with no prior authorization from Norwalk officials.

The City Council voted unanimously in April 2020, to impose a temporary ban to prevent motel conversions for Project Roomkey without prior City approval. The County then sued the City and in April 2020, a judge issued a temporary restraining order directing the City to comply with the State. The City Council then unanimously passed an emergency ordinance in July 2020 that required any public agency to consult with the City prior to placing a homeless or COVID-19 facility in Norwalk.

The City of Norwalk has always been a willing participant in doing its fair share in its fight against homelessness. The City's own homelessness taskforce and HOPE team have directly contributed to the rapid decrease in the most recent homeless counts by the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority.

City Council Approves Second HOPE Team

On August 17, 2021, the Norwalk City Council was presented with an assessment of the City of Norwalk's second Homeless Operation Prevention and Engagement (HOPE) team.

The City Council voted unanimously on June 15, 2021, to fund a second, full-time, HOPE team after directing the Public Safety Department to assess the value of adding a second team and determining that the addition of a second HOPE team would greatly benefit the City.

The HOPE team has been instrumental in cleaning up areas in the City where homeless individuals or encampments left large amounts of debris and trash. The team works with Social Services to help the homeless population obtain specialized assistance.





The HOPE team consists of a lieutenant, one Public Safety Officer, two maintenance workers, and a code compliance inspector that works with the team. Some of the HOPE team's duties include conducting outreach, educating the homeless on available services, and addressing resident and business concerns.

The creation of the HOPE team has taken some burden off Public Safety Officers and LASD deputies and freed them up to handle other types of service calls. However, the HOPE team only works Monday through Friday and in the daylight hours when service providers are accessible.

The addition of a second HOPE team will expand the team's coverage into the evening hours. The second HOPE team will work Wednesday through Sunday giving the City a dedicated homeless engagement team 7-days a week.

It's Time for Curb **Address Painting**

Every two years, the City selects an independent contractor to repaint the curb addresses citywide. Care for the Children (CFTC) has been selected to repaint curbs beginning in September.

Residents will receive a flyer from CFTC representatives informing them of painting procedures prior to the painting taking place. Once the painting is completed, CFTC will be soliciting voluntary donations which are tax deductible, however, residents are not required to give a donation for the work. Please be advised that curb painters contracted with the City must always carry their identification badges and a copy of their City business license when painting addresses or soliciting donations. Report any unauthorized painting activity by calling the Public Safety Department at 562-929-5732 during the following hours: Monday – Friday from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m., and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. After these hours, please contact the Norwalk Sheriff's Station at 562-863-8711.



Get Help with Home Repair Costs

Is your roof leaking? Are your windows drafty? The City of Norwalk can help qualified households make needed home repairs. Assistance is available to Norwalk property owners who have owned and lived in the property for a minimum of 2 years and whose household income is within certain limits (see chart below). Homes must be owner-occupied, single family dwellings, including mobile homes and condominiums/ townhomes, and tenant-occupied 1-4 unit rental properties*.

Norwalk Housing Authority is here to help!

The Norwalk Housing Authority administers the federally funded Housing Choice Voucher Program. The program provides rental assistance to low-income residents. Here are some of the top financial advantages enjoyed by rental housing providers who rent to voucher tenants.

On-Time, Convenient Payments

The housing authority pays our portion of the rent on the 1st business day of the month. You may elect to have the payment direct deposited into your bank account.

Free Marketing

We will list your vacancy for free. By advertising with us, you will have access to a large pool of tenants that you screen for suitability for tenancy.

Competitive Rents

We strive to offer competitive rents, as long as comparable rents exist in the neighborhood, and the tenant's rent portion is affordable.

Protection from Tenant Financial Losses

When a voucher tenant's income decreases, the housing authority's rent portion increases to cover the loss of income. This provides the landlord and tenant with a valuable form of insurance against tenant income losses.

Incentive for Tenant Lease Compliance

To increase tenant compliance, we provide counseling to tenants who have received warnings from their landlords.

Safeguard Against Lost Rent During Eviction

Unfortunately, not every tenant will live up to their lease agreement and the landlord will be forced to evict. If this occurs with a voucher tenant, we will continue to pay the housing authority's share of the rent throughout the eviction process until the date the tenant moves out or is locked out by order of the court.





Prevention of Overcrowding

Throughout southern California, families are doubled or tripled up in small units in order to afford the rent. Overcrowding increases the landlord's utility costs, places additional wear and tear on the unit, and leads to conflicts. We restrict the number of individuals allowed in the subsidized unit, which eliminates the potential for overcrowding.

Owner Maintains Control

You continue to maintain control over all aspects of management, maintenance, and lease enforcement.

National Preparedness Month

September is National Preparedness Month, where we raise awareness about the importance of being prepared for disasters and emergencies. Whether it's earthquakes, fires, severe heat, or pandemics, Southern California has a lot to prepare for. Here are some simple steps that you can take to help protect yourself and your loved ones in the event of a disaster.



• Make a Plan - Talk to your friends and family about how you will communicate in the event of a disaster. Discuss meeting places and establish an out of town contact that you can all check in with.



• Build a Kit – Gather supplies for everyone in your home (including pets) that will last for several days. Include food, water, a first aid kit, flashlights, and a batterypowered radio.



• Be in the Know - Find out what hazards are in your area, locate your gas and water shut-off valves, and check your insurance coverage for things like fire, flood, and earthquakes.



• Get Connected - Sign up for emergency notifications through the City's Nixle App. We'll alert you about major disasters, emergencies, and accidents that are happening in Norwalk. Simply text 90650 to the number 888777.

This school year may look a little different compared to others but in-person classes have returned. With school back in session, it is likely that your families will be pedestrians operating in school zones at some point during the school year. Please follow these safety tips to help ensure everyone stays safe.

- Use the sidewalk whenever possible, and if there isn't a sidewalk, walk on the edge facing traffic as far from traffic as possible.
- Make sure you never play, push or shove others when you are walking near traffic.
- Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
- Keep alert at all times; don't be distracted by electronic devices that take your eyes (and ears) off the road.
- Whenever possible, cross streets at crosswalks or intersections, where drivers expect pedestrians. Look for cars and bikes in all directions, including those turning left or right.
- If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate an open area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely; continue watching for traffic as you cross.
- Never assume a driver sees you. Make eye contact with drivers as they approach to make sure you are seen.
- Be visible at all times. Wear bright clothing during the day, and wear reflective materials or use a flashlight at night.
- Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots.
- Avoid alcohol and drugs when walking; they impair your abilities and your judgment.
