CNG Gas Station is Finished

Construction has been completed on Norwalk Transit's new Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) station, which has the



capacity to provide the City's fleet of 14 CNG vehicles with a cleaner, more environmentally friendly fuel source.

Clean Energy Inc. was awarded the contract to design, build and operate the new private CNG fueling station for the City of Norwalk Transit System. Following the groundbreaking ceremony, construction began in May 2014. Also, in order to maintain NTS' growing fleet of compressed natural gas vehicles (NGVs), Clean Energy completed upgrades to the maintenance facility with a code-compliant methane detection system in July 2014.

The current fleet of 14 NGVs is forecasted to consume approximately 150,000 gasoline gallon equivalents (GGEs) of CNG per year, reducing harmful greenhouse gas emissions by approximately 316 metric tons, the equivalent of removing 65 passenger cars from the road each year. This volume is expected to double once the fleet is fully-deployed.




