City Helps Open Temporary COVID-19 Testing Site



The City of Norwalk, at the direction of the City Council, was proactive in opening a COVID-19 testing site due to the surge in COVID-19 cases and a critical need to develop sufficient testing sites in Los Angeles County on an emergency basis. This testing site was the first city initiated mega testing site in the Gateway Cities region, this year.

The City of Norwalk partnered with American Safety Group (ASG) and Inspire Diagnostics to provide this convenient drive-thru COVID-19 testing service to the community last month.

The temporary drive-thru COVID-19 testing site was set-up at the Norwalk/Santa Fe Springs Metrolink

Station. The testing site serviced over 20,000 people within the first two weeks of operation. The site will remain open at least through February to keep up with the demand for testing.

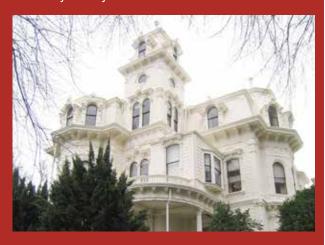
Emergency Powers

Certain portions of Governor Gavin Newsom's emergency proclamation continue through March 31, 2022. In early January 2022, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) extended its statewide requirement that masks be worn in all indoor public settings, irrespective of vaccine status, through at least February 15, 2022. As a reminder, this requirement supersedes all prior face covering guidance.

The executive order and State requirement comes while approximately 76.2% of L.A. County residents have been fully vaccinated.

The City of Norwalk is committed to the health and safety of our community and will continue to share information that impact our residents.

Local Streets Rehabilitation Program



The program started last year with the City getting a rating system developed for almost onethird of its streets, roads, and alleys to prioritize the areas needing street rehabilitation. The Norwalk City Engineer Division determined which local roadways will be part of the street rehabilitation project based on this rating system.

Last year, Zones 24, 27, and 32 were completed using funds from Measure R, passed by voters in 2008, and Measure M, passed by voters in 2016.

Zone 28 will be the first area worked on this year. Most of the funding for this project is coming from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. Zone 28 is bounded by Excelsior Drive, Norwalk Boulevard, Alondra Boulevard, and Pioneer Boulevard.

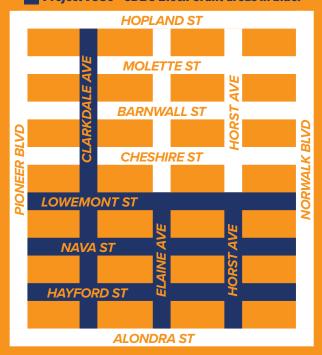
The project's objectives in Zone 28 are to replace slotted cross gutters to current standards, install corner access curb ramps and improve the roadway pavement condition within the project limits. Residents in the affected work areas will be asked to seek alternative accommodations during this time to ensure work can be completed in a timely and efficient manner.

More zones are planned for repairs as well this

year, so be sure to follow the City's social media pages for more information as it becomes available.

Home COVID-19 Test Scam

We would like City of Norwalk residents to be cautious when purchasing at-home COVID-19 test kits. There have been reports of fake and unauthorized at-home COVID-19 test kits being sold by scammers. These scammers are targeting Medicare beneficiaries and retirement communities in exchange for personal medical information. Below are some safety tips that may help you or a loved one from falling victim to this scam:



- Be careful! Make sure to only purchase FDA approved COVID-19 test kits from legitimate providers.
- Do not buy fake vaccination cards, do not make your own vaccination cards, and do not fill-in blank vaccination record cards with false information.
- Do not provide personal, medical, or financial details to anyone in exchange for vaccination information, and only obtain vaccinations from trusted providers.
- Offers to purchase COVID-19 vaccination cards are scams. Valid proof of COVID-19 vaccination can be provided to individuals only by legitimate providers administering vaccinations.
- Be cautious of COVID-19 survey scams. Do not give your personal, medical or financial information to anyone claiming to offer money or gifts in exchange for your participation in a COVID-19 vaccination survey.
- Be mindful of how you dispose of COVID-19 materials such as syringes, vials, vial container boxes, vaccination record cards, and shipment or tracking records. Improper disposal of these items could be used by bad actors to commit fraud.
- Photos of COVID-19 vaccination cards should not be shared on social media. Posting content that includes your date of birth, healthcare details or other personally identifiable information can be used to steal your identity.

- Beneficiaries should be cautious of unsolicited requests for their personal, medical, or financial information. Medicare will not call beneficiaries to offer COVID-19 related products, services, or benefit reviews.
- Be suspicious of any unexpected calls or visitors offering COVID-19 tests or supplies. If you receive a suspicious call, hang up immediately.
- Do not respond to, or open, hyperlinks in text messages about COVID-19 from unknown individuals.
- Ignore offers or advertisements for COVID-19 testing or treatments on social media sites. If you make an appointment for a COVID-19 test online, make sure the location is an official testing site.
- Do not give your personal or financial information to anyone claiming to offer HHS grants related to COVID-19.
- Be aware of scammers pretending to be COVID-19 contact tracers. Legitimate contact tracers will never ask for your Medicare number, financial information, or attempt to set up a COVID-19 test for you and collect payment information for the test.
- If you suspect COVID-19 healthcare fraud, report it immediately online or call (800) 447-8477.

The City of Norwalk would like to remind residents to slow down and obey the posted speed limits. Your risk of crashing increases

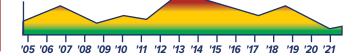

Our Norwalk Sheriff's Deputies and Public Safety Officers diligently patrol the City to stay as proactive as possible to deter crime from occurring. Together, we can all continue this downward trajectory of crime here in Norwalk.



Vehicle Break-in Safety Tips



Community members are the eyes and ears of neighborhoods and law enforcement agencies rely on them to report suspicious activity. See something, hear something, say something.

If a crime is in progress, call 9-1-1. All other calls, please call the non-emergency Norwalk Sheriff's Station line at 562-863-8711 or the Public Safety Department at 562-929-5732. Law enforcement has seen an increase in vehicle break-ins in Kia and Hyundai models throughout Southern California. We ask that if you or a loved one has a Kia or Hyundai vehicle, please take extra precautions and stay vigilant when parking your vehicle and leaving it unattended. Installing anti-theft devices such as audible alarms, steering wheel locks, and vehicle tracking systems are great deterrents from thieves. Taking a few extra steps

may help you lessen the chances of your car being stolen.

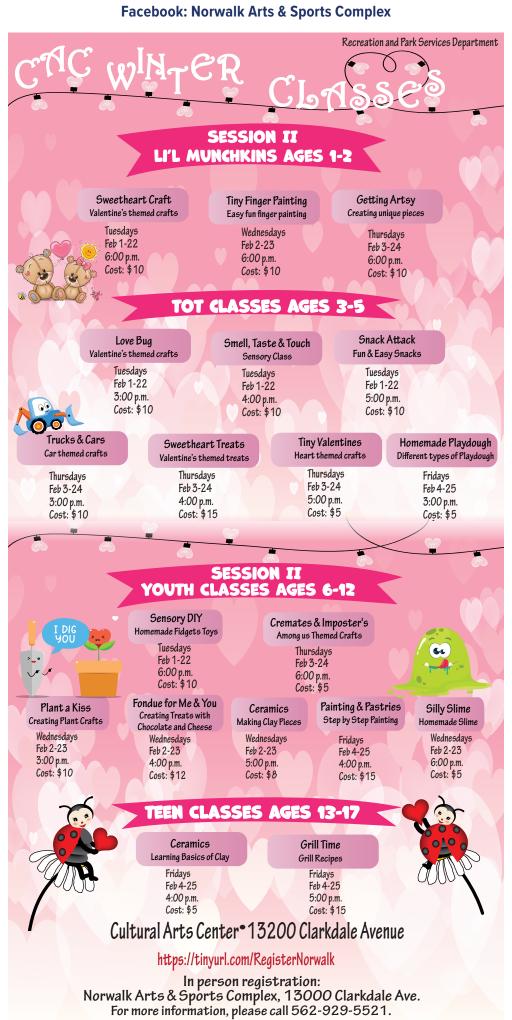
