On April 20, 2022, U.S. District Judge Kathryn Kimball Mizelle struck down the national mask mandate covering airlines and other public transportation. However, locally, the Los Angeles County Public Health Department issued a Health Officer

Order on April 21, 2022 "... to note that masking in all public transit within LA County and in LA County indoor transportation hubs continues to be required."

What this means is that everyone, 2 years of age

Governor Gavin Newsom's "Emergency Powers" and older, regardless of their COVID-19 vaccination status, must wear a mask on public transit including

> commuter trains, subways, buses, taxis, and ride-shares.

> The Health Officer Order also requires that masks be worn in indoor transportation hubs including airport and bus terminals, train and subway stations, seaport or other indoor port terminals, or any other indoor area that serves as a transportation hub within the County.

Local Streets Rehabilitation Project Update

Work has officially been completed in Zone 28 for the Local Streets Rehabilitation Project. This project was funded by Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and includes funding from the Road Maintenance Rehabilitation Account (RMRA) and Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 3.

The concrete work done in this zone included the replacement of slotted cross gutters, the replacement of various sidewalks and curbs, and several corner access curb ramps to meet current standards. The asphalt replacement was also completed on time.

The next zones that will be worked on are Zones 3, 8, and 19, which are expected to begin



Lakeside Middle School Information

Lakeside Middle School, home of the Mustangs, is one of nine schools in the Little Lake City School District. There are seven elementary and two middle schools. Little Lake is truly a hidden gem of a district! Every school is an award-winning school. Truly, if a family wants their child to go to a stellar school district, Little Lake should be their choice.

The district has a middle school in Norwalk called Lakeside Middle School. During the last 8 years, since the 2014-15 school year, Lakeside has received both state and national level awards called the California League of Schools, Schools to Watch and the National Forum to Accelerate Middle Grades Reform, Schools to Watch. The school first received this honor in 2014-2015 but to keep it, the school must apply every 3 years. That's called a "redesignation" and the school has been redesignated two times (out of two possible) to maintain this status.

With gas prices gradually increasing, we would like to advise residents to use alternate routes away from large gas stations. Large gas stations such, as Costco, tend to become overly congested, with traffic spilling over on to other streets during peak hours. Recently, we have seen congestion increase at the intersection of Imperial Highway and Hoxie Avenue.

The City has been in communication with Costco Management on efforts to lower traffic congestion from the gas station and are exploring various measures to improve traffic conditions in the area. If you are a frequent commuter of this intersection, we request you to use an alternate route for the time



City Moves Closer to Adopting a Preferential Parking Policy

On April 19, 2022, the City Council approved the first passage of Ordinance No. 22-1730, which would amend Title 10 (Vehicles and Traffic) of the Norwalk municipal code to incorporate guidelines for parking permits.

This was part of a recommendation from the Parking Action Plan (PAP) that the City Council approved on March 15, 2022. The PAP adjusted the Preferential Permit Parking Program (PPPP) which was established to address the growing parking demands within the City.

The PAP plan identified recommendations to establish an equitable, adaptable, and efficient parking solution for all Norwalk residents.

The prior PPPP was initially created to address the impact that commuter vehicular traffic was having on nearby residential areas, but over time it was used to provide parking exclusively to certain neighborhoods.

Ordinance No. 22-1730 will now move to a second reading at a future City Council meeting.



Parking Lot Safety Tips

Thieves often target large parking lots for their next victim since they provide easy entry and exit points for them. Many crimes that occur in parking lots include vehicle theft, personal property theft, and theft of car parts. The Public Safety Department would like to provide some safety tips to keep you safe when you find yourself in large parking lots.

- Park near your building or destination in a highly visible and well-lit location.
- · Keep valuables, purses, and purchases out of sight in your vehicle. Always lock them in your trunk.
- Always be aware of your surroundings and limit distractions (looking at your phone, wearing earphones,
- When possible, always try to walk with someone to and from your car.
- Call the authorities to report suspicious activity.



Panhandling Scammers

We would like to warn residents of a possible scam occurring throughout the region. The scam involves people wearing yellow traffic

vests and panhandling for money. The scammers are known to walk out into intersections or hangout at gas stations asking for money. Norwalk Transit Receives Funding for More Electric Buses



On March 14, 2022, President Biden and the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Transit Administration awarded \$409.3 million in grants to 70 projects in 39 states to modernize and electrify America's buses, make bus systems and routes more reliable, and improve their safety.

Of this money, the Norwalk Transit System will receive \$3,530,822 in funding to buy zeroemission, battery electric buses to replace older buses that have reached the end of their useful life and charging infrastructure. This project will improve air quality as well as service reliability while maintaining a state of good repair.

This funding helps continue NTS's goal of having a 100% zero emission battery electric bus fleet.



- ✓ Must show inability to make rent, mortgage, or utility payments due to the impacts of COVID-19
- ✓ Must be extremely low, very low, low-to-moderate income
