
#### **Project Overview**

- Demolition of the former California Youth Authority (CYA)
  facility to allow for the future development of a mixed-use
  transit-oriented community.
- The existing facility was developed in 1943 as an all-male youth correctional facility operated by the CYA.
- In 2011, the CYA facility operations ceased and the project site remained vacant until 2019, at which time the facility was temporarily utilized by the Department of State Hospitals (DSH) due to the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) pandemic.

#### **Project Overview**

- Establishment of the Norwalk Transit Village Specific Plan and Tentative Tract Map to allow for the future development of a mixed-use transit-oriented community that includes the following:
  - ▶ Up to 770 residential units
  - Up to 13,500 square feet of ancillary commercial (office/retail use)
  - ▶ A maximum of 10,000 square feet of quasi-civic uses
  - A non-residential block containing commercial uses with a maximum floor area ratio of 0.50
  - ► A 150-key hotel
  - Common and private open space areas

To identify ways to <u>avoid or</u> <u>mitigate</u> significant environmental impacts;




To enhance <u>public</u> <u>participation</u> in the planning process; and
