City Council Approves Senior Nutrition Program

On June 21, 2022, the Norwalk City Council approved the continuation of the Social Services Department's Senior Nutrition Program for the Fiscal Year 2022/2023.

The Senior Nutrition Program provides Norwalk seniors with congregate meals at the Senior Center and Social Services Center, and it ensures that home bound seniors receive home delivery meals.

During the pandemic, the City continued to provide hot, fresh, and frozen meals to over 250 seniors throughout the first three quarters of the past fiscal year. There have been more than 60,000 meals delivered to congregate seniors and over 40,000 meals were delivered to home bound seniors.

On April 25, 2022, after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic, the City reopened the Senior Center and Social Services Center to allow seniors to return to enjoy in-person daily hot meals, while still providing daily hot meals to over 200 Home Bound Seniors.

This program is essential to provide the City's senior community with a health meal, some of which might be their only meals for the day.

Emergency Powers Update

Due to the increasing number of COVID-19 cases, it is highly recommended that all residents wear masks and comply with any masking mandates that may be in effect. Masks are an effective tool to help slow the spread of COVID-19, especially in crowded spaces and indoor settings.

The Los Angeles County Public Health Department's Health Officer Order currently requires masks to be worn at all indoor transportation hubs and on all public transit within L.A. County.

This Health Officer Order covers all commuter trains, subways, buses, taxis, ride-shares, airport and bus terminals, train and subway stations, seaport and other indoor port terminals, or any other indoor area that serves as a transportation hub within L.A. County. The Health Officer Order also includes all City of Norwalk public transportation services.

NTS to Acquire New Asset/Inventory Management System



Vehicle Maintenance will be acquiring a new asset/ inventory management system by replacing the current legacy system (FASTER). Complete, real-time, easily accessible data will enhance staff and management ability to maximize availability, usage, and cost effectiveness of resources.

The new Fleet Maintenance Management System (FMMS) will allow for parameters for aging, maintenance costing, fuel consumption, and mileage on each vehicle type and vehicle application.

This will allow NTS the means of identifying and tracking vehicles that have reached their usefulness and need of replacement. Ideally, the new FMMS will be capable of tracking monthly contributions and providing a real-time replacement balance on the equipment module.

In the City of Norwalk, there are five different classifications for commercial use:


- C-1: Restricted Commercial
- C-3: General Commercial
- CM: Commercial Manufacturing
- PO: Professional & Office
- CO: Commercial & Office


Zones designated with any of the commercial use classifications are generally used for the purpose of a commercial property. The type of classification determines what type of business can potentially operate within the commercial zone.

Athens Services to Conduct Route Audits



California's new organics waste law, SB 1383, requires municipalities to monitor and audit how well they are separating organics waste from trash. To accomplish this, Athens Services will support the City of Norwalk by reviewing residential and commercial routes quarterly.

Athens' audit team of "Lid Flipper" Jeeps will audit, photograph, and report on contamination in green lid containers. The findings will be shared with customers for education purposes and municipalities for reporting. This program will help the City of Norwalk meet the goals of SB 1383 and reduce the amount of organics waste that is discarded at landfills.

Back to School Traffic Safety Tips

With children returning to school, Public Safety would like to remind parents to travel safely in school zones. Parents can anticipate congested streets around school zones and are responsible for obeying all traffic laws in these areas at all times. Common violations include:

- Blocking entrances/driveways
- 25 MPH speed limit in school zones
- Not using pedestrian crossings correctly
- Parking zone restrictions (red curbs, etc.)
- Impeding/blocking traffic
- Loading/unloading passengers from vehicles stopped in the street
- Not wearing seat belts / using proper child restraint systems
- Not yielding to children while crossing
- · Passing buses with stop signs displayed



School Loading Zones

We would like to remind residents to be mindful when parking in Loading Zones (painted white curbs) in front of schools. School Loading Zones are intended for loading and unloading only. We ask everyone to abide by all loading zone regulations to keep everyone safe. Any observed or reported loading zones violations are subject to citation. Thank you for your support and adherence.

Let's Talk Trash





Help keep Norwalk clean by storing trash, green waste, and recycling bins out of public view.

On regularly scheduled trash collection days, trash bins may be placed at the curb for disposal up to 24 hours before the day of collection and must be removed and properly stored by 6 a.m. following the designated day of collection.

Large, bulky items may not be placed out for collection without first contacting your trash collector and arranging for pick up.

- Residents of single-family homes may pre-arrange collection of up to FIVE bulky items once a week at no additional charge.
- Residents of multi-family dwellings may call in bulky item pickups 12 times a year at no additional charge.

To schedule a bulky item pick-up, please call 1(800) 333-0191. If you observe an illegally dumped item in your neighborhood or anywhere throughout the City, you can report by calling 1(855) 557-1007.
