Emergency Powers Update

On September 8, 2022 the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) published the results of the 2022 Greater Los Angeles Point-in-Time (PIT) Homeless Count.

Due to the pandemic, there was no PIT Homeless Count in 2021. However, the 2022 results indicated 311 homeless people in the City of Norwalk compared to the 168 homeless count in 2020.

The increase was due to the City of Norwalk having the largest Project Roomkey site in the Gateway Cities region. The 210-room Saddleback Hotel, located on Firestone Blvd. operated from May 7, 2020 through August 4, 2021. This state-initiated program under the governor's emergency powers temporarily housed people experiencing homelessness. Over 300 people abandoned the program and integrated themselves into the city, increasing the total homeless count.

In April 2018, the City Council implemented the Plan to Prevent and Combat Homelessness. This plan created the Homeless Task Force also known as Homeless Operation Prevention and Engagement (H.O.P.E.) team.

In June 2022, the City Council enhanced Norwalk's Social Services Department by adding a second H.O.P.E team, which operates evenings and weekends. This allowed the city to provide homeless support services 7-days a week. These efforts will continue to assist the homeless population in transitioning into permanent housing.



State of the City Address at the NASC!

November 2022 General Election Information

Improving Our Infrastructure

The Norwalk Municipal Water System (NMWS), which is one of three water providers in the City of Norwalk, is committed to delivering high quality water and reliable service. The City is focused on improving and expanding its existing water distribution system. The 2014 Water Master Plan recommended construction of a new water distribution main along Pioneer Boulevard between 166th St. and 160th St. to also include the replacement of existing water main pipes along several commercial and residential cross streets between Pioneer Blvd. and Clarkdale Ave.

The City will move forward with installing approximately 3,335 feet of new 12-inch pipeline,





3,610 feet of new 8-inch pipeline, and 11 new fire hydrants. The project is estimated to start Winter 2022 but supply chain issues may cause delays. After construction on Pioneer Blvd. is completed, the work will progress in the east direction towards Clarkdale Ave. The streets affected by this work will be 166th St., 165th St., Cedarvale St., 164th St., Chesterton St., 163rd St., 162nd St., 161st St., and Algardi St.

The entire pipeline project is anticipated to take approximately six months to complete. Construction will be phased in to minimize the impact to City residents and businesses. Those affected by construction or delays will be notified in advance of work in their area.

- Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.
