California's COVID-19 State of Emergency is scheduled to end on February 28, 2023. The State of Emergency declaration gave Governor Newsom broad powers to issue mandates and temporary orders to protect health and life.

The Los Angeles County Public Health Department is recommending that all residents wear masks and comply with any masking mandates that are in effect. Masks are still required indoors at healthcare and congregate-care facilities, for anyone exposed to the virus in the past 10 days, and at businesses where they are required by the owner.

Improving our Infrastructure

162ND ST.

The Norwalk Municipal Water System (NMWS), which is one of three water providers in the City of Norwalk, is committed to delivering high quality water and reliable service. The City is focused on improving and expanding its existing water distribution system. The 2015 Water Master Plan recommended construction of a new water distribution main along Pioneer Blvd. between 166th St. and 160th St. as well as the replacement of existing water main pipes along several streets between Pioneer Blvd. and Clarkdale Ave.

The City will move forward Pioneer Blvd.from 160th to 166th St with installing approximately 3,335

feet of new 12-inch pipeline, 3,610 feet of new 8-inch of work in their area.

Project NO.7442 Water Main Replacement Project on

pipeline, and 11 new fire hydrants. After construction on Pioneer Blvd. is complete, the work will continue towards Clarkdale Ave. The streets affected by this work will be 166th St., 165th St., Cedarvale St., 164th St., Chesterton St., 163rd St., 162nd St., 161st St., and Algardi St.

The City of Norwalk has scholarships available to assist low income residents with the cost of technical training in health sciences, medical technology, or welding/metal fabrication programs.

The workshop will provide information to interested potential first-time homebuyers about the program. The First Time Homebuyer Program (FTHB) is made available through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) HOME funds for Down payment and Closing Costs Assistance to help low-income households buy their first home in the City of Norwalk. The City's investment of HOME funds will be limited to down payment and closing costs assistance through no interest deferred loans.

Public Safety Department Accomplishments

- Responded to approximately 65 crime scenes to provide latent fingerprinting services resulting in criminals being identified and apprehended. Fingerprints are often lifted from crimes such as, burglaries, robberies, stolen vehicles, and thefts.
- Responded to 16,434 calls for Assisted in recovering 81 reported stolen vehicles.
 - · Assisted the Norwalk Sheriff's Department with 285 traffic collisions.
 - Hosted 4 Coffee with a Cop events to offer opportunities for residents to engage with the law enforcement personnel who serve their community.
- Hosted 41 cadet meetings to provide insight on officer operations, career exploration, and educational safety.
- The Code Compliance Division is responsible for enforcing the Norwalk Municipal Code to upkeep property maintenance and zoning requirements.

Accomplishments Made Throughout 2022

- 12 Mini Mr. Sun Clean-ups where Norwalk residents were able to dispose of bulky items at no cost.
- 948 cases reviewed and 472 cases closed
- 73 business license inspections were conducted.
- Initiated an education campaign to deter and prevent illegal dumping by mailing out educational letters and mailers to residents, property owners, and managers in the City. The letters provided information on the free bulky item pickup services provided by Athens Services.






