New Laws for 2023

Are you familiar with new laws that went into effect in 2023?

Below are new laws that were implemented beginning January 1, 2023:

Jaywalking

• *Assembly Bill 2147 allows pedestrians to jaywalk (or cross the street outside of an intersection) without being ticketed, however, pedestrians must cross when it is safe to do so.*

Paid Family Leave

• *Senate Bill 951 increases the share of paid family leave provided to lower-income Californians. This law extends what was a temporary increase in the benefit from 55% of wages to 60% or 70% depending on income.*

Minimum Wage Increase

• *Senate Bill 3 (passed in 2016) raised California's minimum wage to \$15.50, up from \$15 for large employers and \$14 for smaller employers compared to last year. Although this bill isn't new, it ties the minimum wage rate to inflation but is capped at 3.5%.*

Feather Alert System

• *Assembly Bill 1314 creates an alert system for law enforcement agencies investigating the suspicious or unexplainable disappearance of an indigenous woman or indigenous person. The Feather Alert will provide immediate information to the public to aid in the swift recovery of missing indigenous persons.*

New Holidays

- *Genocide Remembrance Day (April 24)*
- *Juneteenth (June 19)*
- *Lunar New Year (2nd or 3rd new moon after Winter Solstice)*
- *Native American Day (fourth Friday of September)*

More Safety for Bicyclists

• *Assembly Bill 1909 makes some changes to laws affecting bicyclists, drivers, and pedestrians who share California roads.*



§ *The bill requires drivers to change lanes before passing a cyclist if a lane is available. The bill also prohibits cities from requiring bicycle licenses. A portion of the bill doesn't go into effect until 2024, which will allow bikers to cross the street at pedestrian signals instead of only at green traffic lights.*

COVID-19 Exposure Alerts Until 2024

• *Assembly Bill 2963 requires workplaces to continue providing employees with COVID-19 exposure notifications until 2024.*

State Website to Report Retail Theft

• *Assembly Bill 1700 sets up a section on the state Attorney General's office website to report stolen items.*

Pink Tax

• *Assembly Bill 1287 prohibits gender-based pricing on products based on who they're marketed toward.*

Unused Retail into Homes and Communities

• *Assembly Bill 2011 aims to boost housing production and affordability by turning unused retail spaces into homes and communities.*

On Friday, December 29, 2022, President Joe Biden signed into law H.R. 2617, also known as the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, which includes a \$976,962 earmark for the City of Norwalk.

The federal funding will be used to acquire and install emergency backup generators at the Norwalk Arts and Sports Complex and the Norwalk Senior Center. The two facilities function as temporary emergency shelters during emergency events, but do not currently have generators.

Natural Gas Price Increases

The Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) is warning customers to expect an increase in their monthly gas bill in the upcoming weeks. Natural gas prices in the Western United States have doubled over the last month due to below-normal temperatures, higher natural gas consumption, and reduced gas flows due to pipeline constraints.

SoCalGas does not set the commodity prices. They are set by regional and national markets. Below are tips SoCalGas has shared to help reduce natural gas usage.

If health permits, lower the thermostat by three to five degrees to save up to 10 percent on

heating costs.

Install proper caulking and weather-stripping around doors and windows to save roughly 10 to 15 percent on heating and cooling bills.

Wash clothes in cold water to save up to 10 percent on water heating costs.

Limit the use of non-essential natural gas appliances such as spas, pool heaters, and fireplaces.

Emergency Powers *Update*

California's COVID-19 State of Emergency declaration is scheduled to end on February 28. Going into the new year, California was one of nine states that still had a COVID-19 State of Emergency declaration. The end of the declaration will remove Governor Gavin Newsom's broad powers to issue mandates and temporary orders to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

The Los Angeles County Public Health Department recommends that residents wear masks at all indoor public places to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the flu, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV).

As a reminder, masks are still required inside healthcare and congregate-care facilities, for anyone exposed to the virus in the past 10 days, and at businesses where they are required by the owner.

GRAFFITI ABATEMENT

GRAFFITI MAY BE REPORTED 24 HOURS A DAY TO THE GRAFFITI HOTLINE AT (562) 929-5555

The City of Norwalk offers graffiti removal on all city facilities and accessible street-facing buildings (exterior walls must be within 6 feet of public right of way), medians, light poles, signal poles, and traffic signs citywide, seven days a week. The City's policy is to remove graffiti within 48 hours after it is reported.

Graffiti is removed using:

PAINT

CHEMICAL CLEANER

PRESSURE WASHING



When reporting graffiti, it is helpful in expediting removal if the following information is provided:

- Specific location including address
- Intersection, or major cross streets
- Type of graffiti such as marker or paint
- Surface where graffiti is located such as block wall, fence, sign, or painted curb

BE PREPARED FOR A FLOOD

Failing to evacuate flooded areas, entering flood waters, or remaining after a flood has passed can result in injury or death.



Know your neighborhoods type of flood risk. Visit FEMA's Flood Map Service Center at <https://msc.fema.gov/portal> for information.

Sign up for emergency alerts.

Text NORWALK to 888-777 to sign up for city alerts.

Visit [alert.lacounty.gov](https://www.lacounty.gov) to sign up for county alerts

If flash flooding is a risk in your location, monitor potential signs such as heavy rain.

Learn and practice evacuation routes, shelter plans, and flash flood response.

Gather supplies in case you have to leave immediately or if services are cut off. Keep in mind each person's needs, including medication. Don't forget the needs of pets.

Obtain flood insurance. Homeowner's policies do not cover flooding. Get flood coverage under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).



Depending on where you are, and the impact and the warning time of flooding, go to the safe location that you have identified.

If told to evacuate, do so immediately.

Listen to EAS, NOAA Weather Radio, or local alerting systems for current emergency information and instructions.

Do not walk, swim, or drive through flood waters. Just six inches of fast-moving water can knock you down, and one foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away.

Stay off of bridges over fast-moving water. Fast-moving water can wash bridges away without warning.

If your vehicle is trapped in rapidly moving water, stay inside. If water is rising inside the vehicle, seek refuge on the roof.

If trapped in a building, go to its highest level. Do not climb into a closed attic. You may become trapped by rising floodwater.



Listen to authorities for information and instructions.

Avoid driving, except in emergencies.

Be aware that snakes and other animals may be in your house. Wear heavy gloves and boots during clean up.

Avoid wading in floodwater, which can contain dangerous debris and be contaminated. Underground or downed power lines can also electrically charge the water.

Use a generator or other gasoline-powered machinery ONLY outdoors and away from windows.

Be aware of the risk of electrocution. Do not touch electrical equipment if it is wet or if you are standing in water. If it is safe to do so, turn off the electricity to prevent electric shock.

Every January, staff and volunteers across Los Angeles County embark on a mission to count the unhoused population throughout the county. The event is organized by the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA), and the results help provide a better understanding and assessment of the state of homelessness in our city and region.
