








### **Artastic Recap**



## First-Time Home Buyer Program Community Workshop

The City of Norwalk is hosting a First-Time Homebuyer Community Workshop on Thursday, April 27 from 5 p.m.- 7 p.m. at the Norwalk Sports Complex – Sproul Room, 13000 Clarkdale Ave.

The workshop will provide information to interested first-time homebuyers about the program. The First Time Homebuyer Program (FTHB) is made available through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) HOME funds for Down payment and Closing Costs Assistance to help low-income households buy their first home in the City of Norwalk. The City's investment of HOME funds will be limited to down payment and closing costs assistance through no interest deferred loans.

## **Streets Master Plan Continues to Improve Quality of Life**

Given the recent storms and their impacts to our roads, the City of Norwalk would like to remind residents that the city remains committed to improving our roads to increase the overall quality of life and safety for its community.



The Local Streets Rehabilitation Project continues in Zones 3, 8, and 19 to further implement the city's Streets Master Plan. The investment for these zones is estimated to be over \$3.7 million, with most of the funding coming from Measure R (2008) and Measure M (2016). No General Fund monies are being used for the Local Streets Rehabilitation Project.

The concrete repairs have been completed in these zones. The asphalt replacement is scheduled to begin by Summer 2023.

Additionally, there are some streets being finished in Zone 28. Most of the work in this zone had been completed last year and the remaining streets that needed repairs are currently being completed. The concrete work has been completed and the asphalt work will be finished by the end of Spring 2023.

## Is your household separating their food waste and placing it in the green waste container?


In 2016, California signed Senate Bill 1383 into law to reduce organic waste disposal. On January 1, 2022, Norwalk residents were required to begin separating their food waste and food-soiled paper from the trash into the organic (green lid) container along with green waste. Instead of taking more waste into a landfill, Norwalk's trash hauler, Athens Services will collect and recycle it into compost that can be used to grow plants and vegetables. Remember to be a global citizen and do your part to reduce waste in the landfill. Separate your food waste and place it in the green lid container.

Distracted driving has become a growing concern in recent years with the increasing use of technology


and other distractions in the car. Understanding the dangers of distracted driving and taking steps to minimize the risks is important.
