NOTICE OF PUBLIC REVIEW AND SOLICITATION OF PUBLIC COMMENTS OF PROPOSED SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN ACTIVITIES FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT FUNDS

**Description:** The City Council will conduct a public hearing to consider the proposed Substantial Amendment to the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan (Plan) for the Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act Funds (CDBG-CV). The Plan is a report that outlines CDBG and HOME funded projects and activities for the FY 2019-2020. A Substantial Amendment is required by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) when funds are reallocated between activities.

On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed and approved the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) to combat the spread and impacts of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). Through the CARES Act, HUD initially granted the City of Norwalk \$747,572 in Community Development Block Grant CARES Act (CDBG-CV1) funds. On September 11, 2020, HUD informed the City that an additional allocation had been granted in the amount of \$850,708 (CDBG-CV3) funds. Total of CARES Act funds granted to the City, \$1,598,280.

The City will be reallocating unused funds from the Business Assistance Program and Emergency Rental Assistance Program activities to the Homeless Assistance activity. The City anticipates the CDBG-CV Program to have \$206,447.88 in unused funds. The reallocated funds will provide for continuing homeless assistance to Norwalk's unhoused neighbors.

Under the Citizen Participation Plan, reallocating funding to an activity triggers a substantial amendment to the Plan. After the Annual Action Plan public review period ends, new activities cannot be added to the Plan without triggering another 5-day public review period and a separate public hearing.

The public is encouraged to review the Substantial Amendment and submit written comments in advance of the public hearing so that the comments may be considered in preparation for the public hearing. ## SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT 2019-2020 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

### Background:

On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed and approved the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) to combat the spread and impacts of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). Through the CARES Act, HUD initially granted the City of Norwalk \$747,572 in Community Development Block Grant CARES Act (CDBG-CV1) funds. On September 11, 2020, HUD informed the City that an additional allocation had been granted in the amount of \$850,708 (CDBG-CV3) funds. Total of CARES Act funds granted to the City, \$1,598,280.

A substantial amendment to the Annual Action Plan is required when the City:

- Changes allocation priorities
- Expects to carry out a new or existing activity while using funds that has not been covered by the Consolidated Plan or included in the approved Action Plan;
- Allocates a substantial change (by \$35,000, except for planning and administration) in funds; or
- Modifies the location, scope, purpose, or recipients of an activity.

A substantial amendment to the Citizen Participation Plan is required when the City expects to alter procedures for publications, public notification, public commenting, and public hearings.

With the citizen participation public comment period and reasonable notice waivers, the City of Norwalk will implement a reasonable public notice and reduce the 30-day commenting period to 5-days for substantial amendments. The waiver for 15 percent public services activities cap will allow the City to fund additional public services activities that serve those affected by COVID-19.

### Proposed Amendment to 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan:

This Amendment will reallocate \$206,447.88 from the Business Assistance Program and Emergency Assistance Program activities to the Homeless Assistance activity to cover costs associated with the extension of the program.

Homeless Assistance
Creation and management of temporary emergency shelters for individuals and
families experiencing homelessness, including operations, security, food,
maintenance, furnishings, utilities etc.

Allocated Amount: \$436,447.88

These activities are eligible under the CARES Act and would greatly assist the City of Norwalk combat against the spread of an infectious disease.
