# **Norwalk Traffic Enforcement Update**



In response to sustained concerns about speeding within our city, the Norwalk Public Safety Department, along with the Norwalk Sheriff's Station's Traffic Enforcement team, have continued traffic enforcement efforts in strategic places throughout the City, including Studebaker Road.

Strict enforcement of speed limits is crucial not only for the safety of motorists but also for pedestrians and cyclists who share the road.

The Norwalk Public Safety Department has been deploying digital message trailers and radar trailers in key locations to remind drivers to slow down. The

goal is to create an environment where everyone can travel safely without the heightened risk of accidents associated with speeding.

Drivers are urged to be vigilant, adhere to posted speed limits, and contribute to the collective effort to make our city streets safer for all.

By emphasizing responsible driving habits and enforcing traffic regulations, the Norwalk Public Safety Department aims to foster a culture of safety and awareness throughout our community. Let's work together to keep our streets safe for everyone.

# **Vehicle Maintenance Safety Tips**

We are in the middle of what is typically the rainy season in Southern California and the Norwalk Public Safety Department would like to share some safety tips to ensure your vehicle is safe for driving in inclement weather.

- ✓ **Routine Maintenance:** Keep up with manufacturerrecommended inspections to ensure your vehicle is in proper working order.
- √ Tire Care: Check tire tread depth (at least 4/32 inch) and
  maintain proper pressure. Monitor automatic tire pressure
  alerts and conduct monthly pressure checks. Follow
  manufacturer recommendations for filling and consider
  changes due to weather.
- ✓ Windshield Wipers: Ensure clear visibility by testing and replacing windshield wipers regularly. Check for warping in regions with prolonged sun exposure.
- ✓ Light Inspection: Regularly examine and replace cloudy or malfunctioning headlights, taillights, brake lights, and turn signals to ensure optimal visibility and safety.

# Tips to Safeguard Against Burglary

As we usher in the New Year, let's prioritize the safety and well-being of our community. Stay vigilant and consider the following safety tips:

**Discreet Package Disposal:** Break down and conceal packaging for valuables before disposing of them. Wait until trash/recycling collection day to avoid leaving clues for potential burglars.

Minimize Visibility: Keep expensive items out of sight from the street view. Close curtains or blinds at night and strategically position items to prevent easy observation.

Adequate Lighting: Install outdoor motion detector lights to deter burglars. Use timers for indoor lights when away for an extended period to create the illusion of an occupied home.

Social Media Advice: Avoid revealing too much information on social media, especially about being away from home. Limit posts that indicate your absence to reduce the risk of burglary.

**Document Valuables:** Take pictures of high-value items and save them digitally. Record serial numbers for traceability. This documentation can aid law enforcement in recovering stolen items in case of a break-in.
