




Celebrate Independence **Day with Norwalk!**

Dog Registration Deadline Coming



Dog licensing for Norwalk dog owners is due every July. Make sure your dog is registered by July 31. To register your dog and obtain a license, you must have their current Rabies Vaccination Certificate. If you are a new dog

The City of Norwalk has a ZERO tolerance policy for illegal fireworks and will seek maximum penalties for all violations. Individuals will be held accountable for any discharge, possession, storage, or sales of illegal fireworks that occur on their premises.

Fines for illegal fireworks can reach up to \$5,000!

Please, be a good neighbor and only use safe and sane fireworks so that everyone can enjoy celebrations safely and responsibly while minimizing the potential dangers and negative impacts on our community. Fire Safety

Campfire Safety: Ensure campfires are fully extingu ished before leaving the site. Use designated fire rings and keep a bucket of water and a shovel nearby.

BBQ Safety: Grill in wellventilated areas away from flammable materials. Never leave the grill unattended and keep a fire extinguisher nearby.

Water Safety

Swimming: Always swim with a buddy and in designated swimming areas. Be aware of ocean currents and rip tides if swimming at the beach.

Supervise Children: Always keep an eye on children when they are near water, even if they know how to swim.

Rave Emergency Notification System

Great news Norwalk! The City of Norwalk has successfully transitioned to a new emergency notification system with the help of our Norwalk Office of Emergency Management.

Introducing Rave, a mass notification system that sends messages quickly and reliably across multiple modes of communication. This move will enable our City and community to be better connected with the state's emergency notification system, which also utilizes Rave.



Users already enrolled in alerting services though Nixle, our former notification system, will not need to take any action.

Financial Exploitation

Know the signs of financial fraud and learn how to protect yourself. This can be a problem for everyone in our community, especially our senior citizens. Please remember to recognize, react, and report.

Criminals use financial exploitation and fraud to deplete the assets of their targets. Fortunately, there are measures you can take to be vigilant of suspicious requests and monitor your financials. In the event you are targeted, you can work with the authorities and other entities to report your case.

Recognize - Be Suspicious If

- A communication states that you've won money, a prize or a free gift - especially if you've never entered a raffle or drawing
- You must pay for processing, shipping and/or taxes on your "free gift"
- You must wire or send money to assist someone in need or receive "winnings"
- It sounds too good to be true, it probably is!

React - Be Proactive

- Set up account alerts
- Organize and store important documents in a safe but easily accessible location
- Review options with your financial institutions to help protect your accounts
- Discuss financial accounts only with trusted friends, family members or financial advisors

Report - Who to Contact

- File a police report and request a copy of the police report and case number.
- Any of the three credit reporting agencies, Equifax, Experian, or TransUnion, to place a "fraud alert" on your credit file.
- Your bank and/or credit card company.
- The Federal Trade Commission's identity theft website or by calling 877-ID-THEFT (877-438-4338).
