Holiday Street Sweeping & Trash Collection Schedule

On Memorial Day, trash collection will be delayed one day. If you are scheduled for Monday,

> May 25, pick-up, your refuse will be collected on Tuesday. If you are scheduled for Tuesday pick-up, your trash will be collected on Wednesday, and so on.

Scheduled street sweeping on Monday will be cancelled due to the holiday. However, normal street sweeping schedules for Tuesday through Friday of that week will be unaffected.

In some cases, this altered schedule may mean that a delayed trash collection day falls on street sweeping day. In these cases, trash receptacles must be placed on the curb in order for the sweeper to properly clean your street. Southeast ROP Offers New Opportunities for Adults




Adults looking to take their careers to the next level or thinking about switching career paths have the opportunity to earn degrees in everything from Health


With construction picking up in Southern California, residents often wonder what development of a site will mean for them and for the community.

Beautiful Homes and Businesses Wanted



Imperial Highway & Pioneer Boulevard Project

Crews are preparing to shift the southbound I-5 lanes of traffic (between Pioneer Boulevard and the Silverbow Avenue pedestrian bridge), onto new pavement along the widened, outside portion of the freeway. This traffic shift is tentatively scheduled to take place in June. Additional information will be provided once this work is scheduled.

Construction activity is ongoing on several sound walls along the northbound and southbound I-5. In addition, work continues on the frontage roads along the northbound I-5 (Adoree Street) and southbound I-5 (Southbound Frontage Road). In the next few months, the contractor is working to open Adoree Street to allow through traffic between Norwalk Boulevard and Imperial Highway.

Rosecrans Avenue & Bloomfield Avenue Bridge Project

Crews are preparing to shift the southbound I-5 lanes of traffic (between the Silverbow Avenue pedestrian bridge and Shoemaker Avenue), onto new pavement along the widened, outside portion of the freeway. This traffic shift is scheduled to occur in May. Additional information will be provided once this work is scheduled.

Paving activity along the southbound I-5 (from Silverbow Avenue pedestrian bridge to Carmenita Road) will be ongoing for approximately five to six weeks, and will include intermittent daytime and nighttime activity. This work may require nightly lane closures along the southbound I-5 freeway, as well as intermittent closures of the southbound I-5 off-ramp at Carmenita Road. Please be advised, night work may be disruptive due to construction lighting, equipment noise and general construction activity.

Carmenita Road Interchange Project

In the coming months, crews will be preparing to shift traffic from the existing Carmenita Road bridge, to the new bridge which is being built alongside the original structure. The new bridge is expected to be finished by June. The traffic shift will include changes to the traffic pattern at Firestone Boulevard and Carmenita Road. More detailed information will be provided before the work is conducted.
