Cities, Agencies Celebrate Completion of New Shoemaker Bridge

Officials from the cities of Norwalk and Santa Fe Springs, along with representatives from Cal Trans, Metro, and the Federal Highway Administration, marked the reopening of Shoemaker Bridge, which was demolished and rebuilt as part of the I-5 Freeway widening project. It is the first project to be completed in the overall schedule of improvements.

"It's a great day today," said the Chairman of the Joint Powers Authority, during a ribbon cutting to mark the opening. "It hasn't been easy on the residents and local businesses but now that it's open, I know they'll be happy."

The Shoemaker Bridge reflects the most southerly boundary of the I-5/Rosecrans segment of the project. The rest of the segment remains under construction. The bridge had to be raised and lengthened to make room for the additional lanes on I-5. The new bridge maintains one lane in each direction, but features improved pedestrian safety including wider sidewalks, stylish fencing and energy-efficient lighting. The larger part of the I-5/Rosecrans segment is about one-fourth

complete, officials from CalTrans report. The Alondra bridge to the south, the only bridge still to be demolished and completely rebuilt, is scheduled to open late this summer. There are now five of six I-5 segments under construction, including Imperial-Norwalk, Rosecrans, Carmenita and Alondra. The Valley View/I-5 segment, the only remaining line yet to begin construction, is scheduled for February 2015. All projects, according to CalTrans, will be completed by late 2018. Firestone Bridge Replacement Continues

Construction on the Firestone Bridge over the San Gabriel River, underway since April, has been mostly confined to the river channel. But starting this month, the existing median island will be removed and traffic reduced to two lanes in each direction. Traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction so that demolition of the existing bridge can begin. The traffic lanes will continue to be reduced to the following:

Now through September - one lane in each direction

September through May 2015 - two lanes in each direction

May 2015 to September 2015 - three lanes in each direction

The bridge will remain open during construction, but expect some congestion. The river bike trail will be open, too, but detoured during some construction activities. The project's aggressive schedule calls for crews working around the clock during some phases to finish by September 2015. For additional information, call the project info hotline.

Public Recreation Area Could Replace 'Tank Farm'

Norwalk's 'tank farm,' which once produced fuel for military aircraft, moved a step closer to transferring ownership from the U.S. Air Force to the City thanks to proposed legislation by Congresswoman Linda Sanchez. Introduced as an amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), the bill was passed by the House of Representatives and designates 15 acres of the 51-acre site to the City.

"My office, since I was first elected to the district representing Norwalk, has worked with the city and the U.S. Air Force to reach an agreement that would turn the former environmental hazard area into a recreational space for the community," Sanchez said.

If passed, the 15 acres would be used for public purposes and transferred at no cost to the City.

"Rarely does an opportunity arise where a single piece of legislation can so dramatically transform an obsolete asset into a dynamic



orwalk's 'tank farm,' which once produced fuel for military aircraft, moved a step statement. "This is a well-crafted bill that's a win-win for everyone, especially the public."

The site was used beginning in the 1950s by the U.S. Air Force to store jet fuel and supplies. It has been shuttered since 2001. A portion may be be used for a public park and recreation area. The remainder of the land will be turned over to the General Services Administration for conveyance, in accordance with the Federal Property Act, according to the Air Force. The Defense Logistics Agency plans to "excavate and replace or treat the last remaining soil requiring remediation by the end of this calendar year," it added. The agency will monitor the groundwater and continue clean-up efforts.


