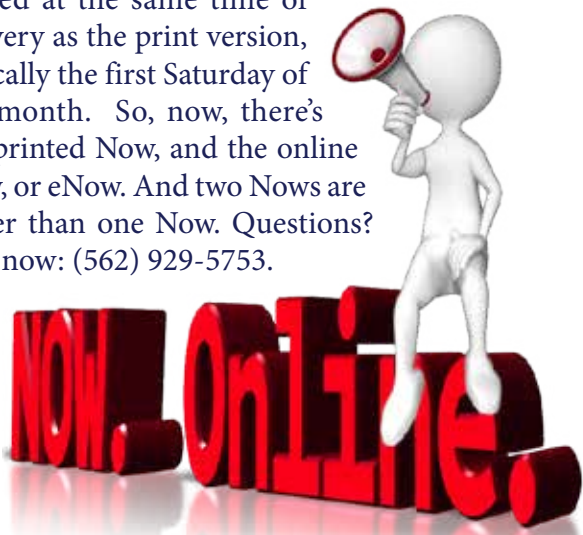


**Now, eNow Gives You More 'Now'**

## City Council Approves Updating Utility Users Tax

*City will place a measure on November ballot to modernize Utility Users Tax ordinance -- originally adopted in 1992.*

In a unanimous vote, Council members at the July 15 meeting approved taking to voters a ballot measure in the November election.

"The measure will ask voters to adopt a modernized UUT ordinance, without raising tax rates, consistent with current IRS guidelines to protect \$2 million in annual revenue critical for senior services, youth and gang prevention programs, neighborhood safety patrols and other important public services," said Mike Egan, City Manager. "The new ordinance will further require voter approval for any future tax increases."

In the coming weeks, the City will initiate a series of community outreach efforts, including public forums, informational materials, and online resources to inform voters on the measure.

Three forums have been slated for August. Informational materials will be provided at the meetings, as well as online. ## West Nile Virus Update: Vector Control Confirms Local Activity



With temperatures expected to rise in Los Angeles County, the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District (GLACVCD) advises residents to protect themselves from mosquitoes by using insect repellent and removing dirty, stagnant water around the home. So far this year, the District has reported a total of 25 positive mosquito samples and three dead birds. In the right conditions, hundreds of mosquitoes can emerge from breeding sources as biting adults in as little as five days.

West Nile virus is transmitted to people and animals through the bite of an infected mosquito. There is no cure for West Nile virus. One in five persons infected with West Nile virus will exhibit symptoms. Symptoms usually occur between five and 15 days, and can include fever, headache, body aches, nausea, or a skin rash. These symptoms can last for several weeks to months. One in 150 people infected with the virus will require hospitalization. Severe symptoms include high fever, muscle weakness, neck stiffness, coma, paralysis, and possibly death.

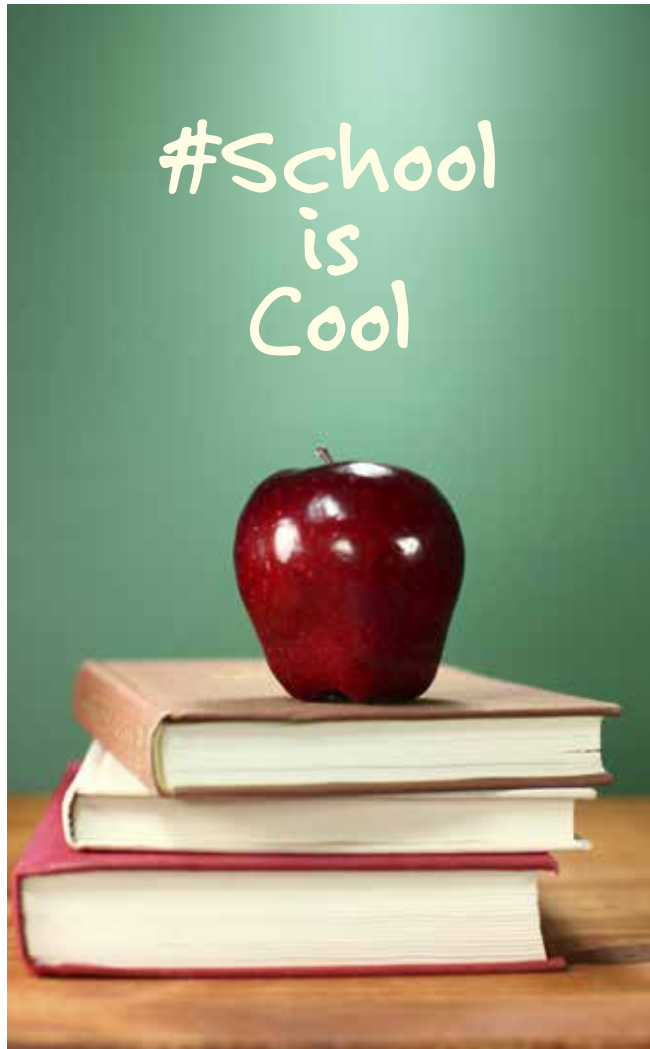
