# **Fox Keynote Speaker for Prayer Breakfast**

David P. Fox is originally from New York City, but has lived around the world before settling in Mission Viejo, California.

He is nephew to Chaplain Rev. George Fox – one of Four Immortal Chaplains of WWII who gave up their lifejackets so that others might live during the sinking of the troopship Dorchester – February 3rd 1943.

In 1997 he co-founded The Immortal Chaplains Foundation. He was joined by other survivors and family members – including crew from the German U-boat 223 which sank the Dorchester.

The Foundation upholds the chaplain's legacy of Interfaith compassion for others of different

faith or ethnicity and presents the Prize for Humanity in their name annually.

The Foundation is located on the bow of the Queen Mary in Long Beach, CA where it maintains an Interfaith Memorial Sanctuary in honor of the chaplains and the 672 men who died. It narrates and portrays the story 24/7 and is visited annually by some 200,000 visitors from around the world.

### **Captain Maxwell Named Prayer Breakfast Master of Ceremonies**

Patrick E. Maxwell, a 21-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, will be the master of ceremonies for the 39th Annual Mayor's Prayer Breakfast.

Captain Maxwell's career with the Sheriff's Department began in September of 1985 as a Sheriff's Deputy Recruit. As a Sergeant, he worked Pitchess North Facility, Norwalk Station, and the Office of the Sheriff. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in April of 2000. In November 2003 he moved to Norwalk Sheriff's Station where he was the Operations Lieutenant.

Captain Maxwell received Bachelor of Arts Degree in Occupational Studies from California State University Long Beach in December 2004.
