## **City Revitalizes Business Visitation Program**

The City of Norwalk Business Visitation Program has been given a new look for 2010-2011 to improve the program's efficacy.

The objective of the program will more clearly focus on informing merchants of available City services, identifying local business needs, and providing information concerning land use, public safety, and signage and property maintenance goals.

Prior to visitations, background information will be obtained to allow the meeting to "hit the ground running" and ensure that City officials are conversant with the issues business owners are facing. Part of the background information will include a public safety history of the business location, including requests for service, reports of graffiti and vandalism incidents.

The first Business Visitation using the new format was held at Studebaker Ave. and Firestone Blvd. Norwalk's Mayor, City Manager, and representatives from the Chamber of Commerce were all in attendance. They met with business owners and employees in the Shopping Center and discussed issues such as loiterers and limited parking.
